
PURPOSE:

SURVEY LOCATION:

A portion of the Southwest Quarter of the Northeast Quarter of Section 27, Township 38 South, Range 3 West, Willamette Meridian,

Jackson County, Oregon.

PURPOSE:

To subdivide a tract of land into two parcels under an agreement dated 11/24/82, which was entered into by the Grosses, The Seversons and the Applegate Christian Fellowship. Legal descriptions referred to as Exhibit A. B and C were used for this Minor Land Partiton and are part of said agreement.

PROCEDURE:

Research revealed the necessity to locate the Quarter corner common to sections 27 and 28 in order to properly ascertain the locations of the three needed 1/16th lines that are pertinent to this survey and as can be seen on attached Plat.

Further research revealed the Section corner common to sections 27, 28, 33 and 34 was lost, which was needed in the re-establishment of said mentioned Quarter corner.

Further investigation revealed that the closest identifiable corner to the West of said mentioned lost Section corner was the Section corner common to Sections 28, 29, 32 and 33 from which point I made a traverse to the closest identifiable corner to the East, being the South Quarter corner of Section 27. Finding the closest identifiable corner to the South of lost Section corner, being the Section corner common to Sections 3, 4 33, and 34, I traverse Northerly, approximately 2 miles to the Section corner common to Sections 21, 22, 27 and 28.

From said mentioned traverses, a straight line East/West and North/South was calculated from corresponding traverses and the intersection point of said two lines was ascertained. Appling the BLM policy of double-proportionate. measurement, a second point was calculated, which position was used in this survey for the corner of Sections 27, 28, 33 and 34. The West Quarter corner of section 27 was also computed: from this newly calculated position and from which position I traversed Easterly to the East Quarter corner of Section 27. From the previously found South Quarter corner of Section 27 I traversed Northerly to the North Quarter corner of Section 27% The Center section position was then calculated by intersecting. corresponding apposite Quarter corners.

Since the Section corner common to Sections 22, 23, 26 and 27 was destroyed years ago in the construction of a pond used for water reservoir purposes, I used registered survey 9216 in relocating the original location. (Survey 9216 shows ties from Highway 238 road stationing to said Section corner, said ties being made prior to Section corners destruction.) This was done by running from the North Quarter corner of Section 27 Easterly through the 1/16th corner common to Sections 22 and 27 (both corners set in registered survey 9216) and extending said line 1337.85 feet being the calculated location of said destroyed corner.

Having tied all necessary subdivision corners, I find the locations of the needed three 1/16th lines, which bound the tract being surveyed, as can be seen on attached Plat.

A portion of the South boundary of tract being surveyed is also the Northerly right-of-way line of Jacksonville Highway No. 238 and Oregon State Highway Department's monuments were used for this control. As can be seen on attached Plat, a portion of the Southerly boundary is also the Northerly boundary of a parcel described in Instrument No. 69-02875 Official Records. Since the control of this Instrument description is the Southwest corner of Donation Land Claim No. 42 and its corresponding West line, I indirectly tied into these through Registered Survey 9216, 6878 and 4857.

Registered Survey 4857 shows corners set on existing fence lines of which do not correspond to the calls per Instrument No. 69-02875 and as shown. The conflict is as shown on attached Plat as Detail A. A boundary line agreement is pending to this date.

Registered Survey 6878 shows a proposed Boundary Line Agreement on the East boundary of Parcel II but no record of its execution was found, said East boundary being the East line of the Southwest Quarter of the Northeast Quarter of Section 27.
