Description of corner evidence found: Found a stone, 8" x 10" x 12", protruding 10 inches above ground. Top of stone is broken. Visible marks as follows:

3 notches on west side and 1 notch visible on southeast side. Stone bears $5.89^{\circ}34'40''E.$, 158.66 feet distance from $33 \mid 34$.

(Record Survey No. 8792 record S.89°05'10"E, 158.45 feet.)

Found unrecorded Elk Lumber Company reference trees with aluminum tags. Scribing has been chopped off.

Description of manument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner

At the corner point, I set a $2\frac{1}{2}$ inch diameter x 30 inch long iron post with a $2\frac{1}{2}$ inch diameter brass cap marked as shown in diagram. I deposit original stone on west side of iron post.

I mark the following accessories:

A 13-inch diameter fir bears N.48°29'E., 41.4 feet distance, scribed AP S34 LS1071 BT.

A 9-inch diameter cedar bears S.16°35'W., 39.8 feet distance, scribed AP S3 LS1071 BT.

PROCEDURE:

Utilizing existing evidence recovered at each corner point, I verified the corner point from recovered accessories, remonumented the corner as needed and marked additional accessories as required to perpetuate the corner point.

BASIS OF BEARING:

Solar observation. Reference Record Survey No.

9367.

HISTORY OF SURVEYS:

The north boundaries of Sections 1, 2, 3 and 4, Township 32 South, Range 2 East, were originally surveyed by Turner and Howard under Contract No. 142 dated September 9, 1870. Peter Applegate performed a resurvey of those boundaries under Contract No. 571 dated April 10, 1891. Applegate changed Turner and Howard's corners to corners of minimum control for Township 32 South, Range 2 East, and established controlling corners for Township 31 South, Range 2 East only, on line between Turner and Howard's corners. In 1896, Surveyor Applegate completed the subdivision of Township 32 South, Range 2 East, under Contract No. 651. Upon running north between Sections 1 and 2, 2 and 3, and 3 and 4, he ran random and true to HIS (Applegate's) corners he set in 1891. Applegate then changed the corners on the Township line to corners of maximum control for Sections 1, 2, 3 and 4 (except for <u>33</u>).

After studying the original plats and field notes, and consultation with Bureau of Land Management Cadastral Surveys Officials, I determined that both the 1870 corners and 1891 corners control alignment. Any found Turner and Howard corners should be treated as angle points, controlling the alignment of the Township line.

Elk Lumber Company (now Boise Cascade Corporation) used this Turner and Howard corner as a section corner for 34 during an unrecorded survey in

1959, as indicated by a blazed line to the south and aluminum tags marked R | P.

The Bureau of Land Management, Division of Cadastral Surveys, destroyed reference to this Turner and Howard corner and remonumented Applegate's 1896 corner for 33 34 in 1966.

Malcolm N. Clark, RLS 601, found the Turner and Howard corner and tied it to the northeast section corner of Section 4 during Record Survey No. 8792 dated March 31, 1981.

No other surveys are of record.
