

SURVEY NARRATIVE TO COMPLY WITH O.R.S. 209.250

PURPOSE:

To survey and monument a Minor Land Partition in the City of Jacksonville.

PROCEDURE:

An examination of the current legal description (D.R. 339-334) for the subject property describes the parcel as being North 207.2 feet and North 41° 30' East, 73.9 feet from the quarter corner to Sections 31 and 32. The quarter corner referred to is not the officially reestablished quarter corner however, but is a quarter corner location established by Surveyor Herman Powell in 1927. (It should also be noted that the legal description in said D.R. 339-334 does not close mathematically by 4.71 feet in latitude and 4.40 feet in departure). This double quarter corner situation is addressed in the narratives for Survey Nos. 1673 and 3530.

Fortunately, Surveyor Powell also described a reference to a stone which was, in fact, the true quarter corner. The description in D.R. 175-403 states "beginning at a point North 41° 30' East 73.9 feet from a point North 37.7 feet from the quarter corner to Sections 31 and 32, which point is also North 66 feet from a stone." This deed further states "it being the intention to convey hereby all my right, title and interest in and to the property as described in 159 Deeds, Page 319 and 159 Deeds, Page 322, together with all interest that I might have as an heir of William Eaton and Irene Eaton, deceased." The Grantor of this deed was Linda Whiteside, formerly Linda Eaton. Linda Eaton received title to the property as an heir in D.R. 159, Page 319 and 322.

Irene Eaton, a widow, conveyed to T. J. Kenney, real property adjacent to the northerly line of the subject property by Deed Volume 42, Page 562, which was subsequently conveyed to August Petard by Volume 42, Page 631.

Irene Eaton subsequently conveyed real property adjacent to the westerly line of the subject property to August Petard by Deed Volume 89, Page 387.

Upon analyzing the conflicting elements of the various deeds, it was concluded that Irene Eaton's intent was to create division lines as described in said D.R. 42-631 and 89-387, relative to the true quarter corner. Unfortunately, the description in D. R. 175-403, recorded January 8. 1929, conveying Linda (Eaton) Whiteside's interest, was based upon Surveyor Powell's erroneous corner location. However, by referencing the stone, accepted as the true quarter corner, it is possible to correlate the conflicting descriptions.

Based upon the above conclusions and the previous retracement shown upon Survey No. 1673, monuments were established as shown on the accompanying plat.
