Procedure

It was anticipated that existing monuments found per Surveys No. 2050 and 3101 could be utilized in place. However, it was found that plastic soil conditions apparently had effected pin movement sufficiently to preclude unverified reliance thereon. Accordingly, the section line was determined between existing monuments on the centerline of Vilas Road and it was discovered that the iron bolt which was set for the south quarter corner of Section 31 at the time of the above mentioned surveys had been recently reset by proportion during an in progress survey for that tract described in D.R. 238-115.

The top of an unbent 5/8" iron pin lying 45° from perpendicular was located several inches below ground surface. This pin, originally set for the southwest corner of Parcel "A" of 0.R. 72-01394 per Survey No. 3101, was reset 30 feet distant from the section line at record position according to said survey at or very close to original location as verified by record angle turned from the section line and running N 0°05'50" W to a 5/8" iron pin found for the northwest corner of 0.R. 72-01304.

Since other monuments found along the west line of Survey No. 3101 were considered to have been subject to soil movement, it was concluded to monument the north line of 0.R. 73-07004 at deed record from the reset 5/8" iron pin previously mentioned. Accordingly, the west line of Parcel No. 1 is not coincident with the as found to be monumented west line of 0.R. 66-02488 as shown on the attached plat.

Witness corners were set along the east line of Parcels 1 and 2 closing to the record location for the east line of the Southwest Quarter of Section 31. These corners were set on the centerline of an abandoned railroad in accordance with data of record per Survey No. 3101. The area between the railroad centerline and the east line of said Southwest Quarter resulted from an "as located and constructed" failure to coincide both lines in accordance with the original deeds of conveyance.

This failure in all probability does not compromise the original intent, subsequent abandonment of the right-of-way and restoration of original title lines. It is believed reasonable to conclude that title to that portion of the railroad right-of-way lying Westerly of the east line of said Southwest Quarter has reverted to the successors in interest of the original grantor and therefore said area was included in the parcels shown.

This affidavit is made and recorded solely to effect correction of the visual Plat so as to conform with the actual survey.
