

An examination of Deed Record 362-100, dated 1952, established a location for the centerline of Pacific Highway, North 84° 00' East, 270.18 feet from said 3/4" iron pipe. This 1952 deed location was accepted as the best available evidence at this time for the Southeast Corner of D. R. 113-30. The Northeast Corner of the M. I. D. tract was established North 38° 15' West, 132.00 feet from the previously described Southeast Corner of D. R. 362-100, and the northerly line established at deed record angle of 74° 54' resulting in a bearing of South 66° 51' West.

This property contains the westerly end of the Phoenix Siphon, which was originally built as a 48" wooden Stave pipe in about 1921 according to the Irrigation District Personnel. In 1957, this wooden pipe was replaced with a buried pipe at approximately the same location. The present pipe is approximately 10 feet southerly of the north property line as determined by this survey.

PURPOSE:

To survey and monument parcel as described in Volume 136, page 176, Jackson County Deed Records.

PROCEDURE:

The Medford Irrigation District received title from H. C. Lockwood to this parcel in 1921 by Deed Volume 136, page 176. The point of beginning for this parcel is described as being the Southeast Corner of a parcel described in Deed Record Volume 113, page 30, which conveyed a parcel from Louie Colver to H. C. Lockwood in 1916. The Southeast corner of said Deed Volume 113-30 is described as "the intersection of the South line of the Louie O. Colver tract in Colver D. L. C. No. 42 with the centerline of the Pacific Highway...."

The true location of the Pacific Highway in 1916 and 1921 is unknown at this time. An examination of the Oregon State Highway Department "Constructed Line" plat, dated October 1925, revealed little to establish its location.

However, evidence seems to support a location very close to the old highway location as shown on certain Oregon State Highway Department maps and surveys dated July, 1951.

Survey No. 50, by C. Z. Boyden dated March, 1948, surveyed and monumented the south line of the Louie Colver tract. This survey was retraced from the 2" iron pipe Initial Point for McCLURG SUBDIVISION, easterly to the 3/4" iron pipe on the westerly side of the Old Phoenix Mill Ditch, and continuing to the 1/2" iron pipe on the easterly side of the Pacific Highway as shown on Survey Nos. 1091 and 1679. Results of this retracement are as shown on the accompanying plat.
