I began this survey by establishing a control survey, tying the required controlling corners to a closed traverse. My survey began at previously established control stations utilized during Record Survey No. 10362. These stations provided my basis of bearing. My control survey included tying line reference monuments established by Surveyor Weaver and County Road Right-of-Way Control recovered by Surveyor McGinty. I also performed a detailed site survey of portions of the Applegate River.

From this information, I computed the subdivision of Section 8 and established the northwest one-sixteenth corner as shown on the attached map of survey. I did not monument the west one-sixteenth corner to Sections 5 and 8. I established a Witness Corner Line Monument at a point south of the Applegate River.

The parcel described within 74-07069 required identification of the Applegate River in order to identify the easterly line of said tract. Southerly of the County Road, the Applegate River segment covered by this survey, is considered non-navigable. The north bank is much steeper than the south bank and a review of various aerial photographs taken from 1971 to present indicate this segment of the River to be relatively stable. Utilizing these facts, I performed a site survey and determined the center line of the River at low water and computed the center line position as shown on the attached map of survey.

Mr. Richard Templin, RLS 1354, was consulted and he referred me to Josephine County Survey No. 2-80 that supported my determination of the River center line.

After having established the position of the center line of the Applegate River, the next step was to recover the right-of-way limit for the County Road as remonumented by Edward McGinty, PLS #301, during Record Survey 2994. Enough of McGinty's control points were recovered to calculate the west right-of-way limit, which is also the east boundary of Parcel A, as indicated in Deed 74-07069. This right-of-way boundary was not marked or posted in the field.

I then ran a series of closed loop traverses, tying in all controlling corners needed to establish the northwest one-sixteenth corner position. Witness corners were established north and south of the Applegate River, as indicated on the corresponding map of survey.

The property boundary, where indicated on the map of survey, was posted with 6-foot aluminum posts with property boundary signs attached. Trees along line were blazed and painted with red timber-marking paint.

PURPOSE :

To establish portions of the South and East boundaries of the NW1/4 NW1/4 Section 8, the NW 1/16 corner and portions of the south and east boundaries of the tract described within document No.

74-07069.

HISTORY

OF SURVEYS Section 8 was originally surveyed by Samuel W. Lackland under Contract No. 429, dated September 20, 1882. The Bureau of Land Management, Division of Cadastral Surveys, remonumented all controlling corners with the exception of the east and west one-quarter corners, which were remonumented by the Jackson County Surveyor.

The north one-sixteenth corner of Sections 7 and 8 was originally set by the County Surveyor and remonumented by Malcolm N. Clark, LS #601, during Record Survey No. 8439, dated May 1980.

Part of Section 8 was subdivided by Kurt C. Weaver, LS #1679, during Record Survey No. 8681, dated November 21, 1980. During this survey, Weaver established a line monument (as indicated on the attached map of survey) on the north line of Section 8, east of upper Applegate Road, and on the east-west center line of the northwest quarter of Section 8 - west of Palmer Creek Road.

Edward McGinty, PLS #301, located the county right-of-way control points for the upper Applegate Road - through part of the north-west quarter of Section 8, while performing Record Survey No. 2994, dated 1965-1966.

No other surveys are of record.

BASIS OF BEARING:

Record Survey No. 10362.

PROCEDURE:

Prior to commencement of my survey, I performed an investigation of the controlling corners and deeds required for establishment of the boundaries and corners in this survey.
