






- = MONUMENT FOUND AS NOTED

The 3/4" iron pipe and the 1" iron pin, which were found, were held for the location of the East line of Volume 243, Page 27. This agrees closely with the deed call tie to the East line of the Old Pacific and Eastern Railroad. said point being the intersection of the North line of Donation Land Claim No. 40 and the East right of way line of Biddle Road. Deed record would be 0.9', more or less, West of said 3/4" pipe. If the information on Recorded Survey No. 305 were to be used, the line would be 0.9' East of said pipe.

SURVEY NARRATIVE TO COMPLY WITH PARAGRAPH 209.250 OREGON REVISED STATUTES

Southwest Quarter Section 18, Township 37 South, Range 1 West, Willamette Meridian, City of Medford,

Jackson County, Oregon

PURPOSE:

To survey and monument that portion of Poplar Drive to be dedicated between Morrow Road and Progress Drive.

PROCEDURE:

Research of the deeds for the properties lying on the southerly side of Morrow Road revealed that they commenced at the Northwest corner of Donation Land Claim No. 40 with a call to the "East line of the Old Pacific and Eastern Railroad right of way as described in Volume 80, Page 609, Deed Records". A search of the City records and the records of Herman Powell (which are in the possession of Mark Boyden, Surveyor) showed that the East right of way line of Biddle Road was the same as the aforementioned right of way line.

A study of Recorded Survey No. 305, which was one of the first recorded surveys done in this area, was done and no correlation between this survey and the deeds of record at the time this survey was done could be made. The deed recorded in Volume 243, Page 27 of Jackson County Deed Records, calls for an iron pipe at the Southeast corner of said volume and page, and an iron pin at the Southwest corner. A search was made in the field for said monuments and a 1" x 18" iron pin was found near the location of the Southeast corner of said volume and page. Due to the construction of Progress Drive, no monument could be found at the Southwest corner of said volume and page.

A further search of Herman Powell's survey records, of Mark Boyden, Surveyor, showed that Herman Powell had done extensive surveying between Morrow Road and McAndrews East of Bear Creek. His plats (unrecorded) show that he created the parcel of land described in Volume 243, Page 27. One plat shows that he set an "I.P." at the Southeast corner and at the point of intersection of the South right of way line of Morrow Road and the East line of Volume 243, Page 27. It should also be noted that he had several computation problems on his plats that may or may not have been corrected in the field before the properties were conveyed.
