
SURVEY NARRATIVE TO COMPLY WITH CHAPTER 209 OREGON REVISED STATUTES

South 1/2 of Sections 22 and 23, Township 38 South, Range 1 West,

Willamette Meridian, Jackson County, Oregon.

PURPOSE:

To locate the centerline of the existing Colver Road in order to establish the location for underground telephone conduit with

reference to the road centerline.

EQUIPMENT:

Lietz Set 4 Total Station

PROCEDURE: The description for Colver Road, dated July 11, 1871, is recorded in Road Record Volume 1, Pages 208-210. This document does not specify a right-of-way width. However, Commissioner's Journal Volume 3, Page 12, dated June 6, 1871, calls for the establishment of a County Road sixty feet in width.

A map of survey of this road is filed in the Jackson County Surveyor's Office as Drawing N-4-6 and is titled Talent-Phoenix Road, by Paul By Rynning, County Engr., and dated July, 1937.

The original 1871 Road Record description follows the Donation Land Claim line and has ninety degree turns at the two existing reversing curves. The 1937 road survey follows the centerline of existing improvements and shows the reversing curves. The 1937 road survey also shows and labels the existing fences at distances other than thirty feet from the existing centerline. There are several recorded surveys in the area which have used the monuments set by the 1937 road survey. We have recovered the monuments shown from the 1937 road survey as well as private surveys.

We have discussed the road centerline location with Mr. Dale Petrasek of the Jackson County Department of Public Works and decided that the monumented 1937 road survey represents the best position for the road centerline. On February 27, 1989, the Jackson County Department of Public Works sent a notice to the property owners along this section of Colver Road notifying them of the County's intention to legalize the right-of-way.

The narrative for recorded survey number 1884 indicates that Surveyor L. E. Ager followed the centerline of the road. Using a road centerline of thirty feet north of a found Agers monument fits the centerline of the existing road, from the railroad tracks east to Highway 99, and also more closely fits the curve delta at P.I. Station 135+89.1, rather than using the south line of DLC No. 59 for the centerline of the road. The north line of the ten foot by fifteen foot telephone company easement has been located at thirty feet south of the road centerline. The easterly line of the easement has been set to clear the various monumented lines and fences of the adjoining parcel to the east.
