At the closing corner common to Sections 22 and 27, I set a 5/8" X 24" iron rod with yellow plastic cap marked "NYGREN LS 1035" and placed the found stone alongside. I also made the existing stone mound larger and scribed the following bearing trees:

6" W. Fir, N72°W, 40.9 ft. 8" W. Fir, S482° W, 44.3 ft.

Meridian is based on solar observation.

A Wild T-16 theodolite and MAC-1E EDM were used to execute this survey.

PURPOSE:

Mark the East line of said Section 22 for logging.

PROCEDURE:

The West line of Section 23, which was surveyed by David R. Thompson in 1858, controls the alignment for the East line of Section 22, which was surveyed by Peter Applegate in 1893. I surveyed the West line of Section 23 and made a diligent search for the Quarter corner. It appears that old logging in this area has destroyed this corner so I re-establish the West Quarter corner of Section 23 by single proportion and set a 5/8" X 24" Iron rod with yellow plastic cap marked "NYGREN LS 1035" and scribed the following bearing trees:

6" W. Fir, N54°E, 34.4 Ft.

8" W. Fir, N1°W, 45.0 Ft.

Thence I traversed from the Southwest corner of section 23, South 0°13'52" East, 341.51 feet to the closing corner common to Sections 22 and 27 at which I found a 12" X 8" X 6" stone and stone mound. I was concerned that this found stone was not obviously notched as per record. Before accepting this stone as the corner point, I made the following observations: The stone set by Peter Applegate at the closing corner common to Sections 15 and 22 is not obviously notched. The presence of the found stone and stone mound situated on a moderate slope in area that appears undisturbed. The distance and bearing from the Southwest corner of Section 23 is well within reason when compared with record.
