



same by deeds were found in the files of Surveyor L. N. Dow as graciously furnished by the present owner of said notes, Surveyor James Andrews. Coordinate sheets of Dow also revealed why the Pernisco Deed (Ins. # 90-31659, O.R.) and the adjoining Kyle deed (Volume 458 Deeds, Page 61) do not close mathematically. In both separate coordinate sheets the bearing of "South" 89° 53' 40" East was calculated instead of North 89° 53' 40" East, making the North-South error of 1.18 feet.

All monuments of this unrecorded subdivision found were 5/8" smooth mild steel monuments, typical of monuments set in that era. We therefore used the monuments found to control the subject properties, proportioned in the missing corners, and monumented same as shown on the annexed map.

To further firm up this procedure, it is being suggested to client that a boundary line agreement between Kyle and Pernisco be recorded and the Title Company correct the error of calling to the North boundary of Volume 454 Deeds, Page 151 to Volume 454 Deeds, Page 451.

PURPOSE:

To locate and monument the corners of tract described in Instrument No.

90-31659, Official Records.

PROCEDURE:

Utilizing E.D.M. equipment, tied to

monuments found as shown on the annexed map. Those monuments found along the East boundary of Filed Survey No. 1003 were not tied in on this survey, but were coordinated from data shown on filed Survey No. 8760.

It was noted that the Pernisco deed was deficient both in the call to the "North line of tract described in Volume 454, Page 151, Jackson County Deed Records" and that the tract, being a parallelogram by bearings, had different distances on the East and West ends.

Filed Survey No. 3258 reports considerable difficulty in matching monuments called for on Field Survey No. 855 and the subsequent deed descriptions, with the actual positions found on the ground.

Our survey also indicates gross deficiencies as to monuments found with respect to the subsequent deeds. Also the bearings and location of Coal Mine Road seem to differ with Filed Survey 855 and 1784, made by the same surveyor.
