

SURVEY NARRATIVE FOR GARY AND DIANE SEITZ, CONT.

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The west boundary of the Albert C. Meyer Subdivision was established from the pins set by Burrell when the subdivision was created. The southwest corner of said subdivision was originally set from the aforementioned referenced monument to the section corner and so was not used to determine the North Line of the adjoining lot to the south (see Boundary Line Agreement recorded under O.R. 91-31568).

The West Line for this survey is intended to be the 1/16 line between the SW 1/4, SE 1/4 and the SE 1/4, SE 1/4 of Section 8. The bearing for this line was taken from RS 10635. The portion of this lot which is westerly of this 1/16 line was not surveyed at the request of the owner who intends to donate that portion of the lot to the City of Ashland.

At the southeast corner of this parcel, dimensions are shown to a lot corner which is 105.00 feet north of the South Line of Section 8 and 208.00 feet west of the East Line of Section 8. Another corner for this lot is shown at 180.00 feet westerly of the Section Corner and along the South Line of Section 8. These distances are from calls made in the deed to this lot and the deed to the parcel being surveyed. Although property pins were found from a survey which is currently in progress, and these pins closely match the record calls, the calls were so specific that the boundary was shown to be exactly at these distances. Bearings and distances to the found pins are then shown.

SURVEY NARRATIVE TO COMPLY WITH PARAGRAPH 209.250 OREGON REVISED STATUTES

LOCATION:

Situated in the Southeast Quarter of Section 8, Township 39 South, Range 1 East of the Willamette Meridian, City of Ashland,

Jackson County, Oregon.

PURPOSE:

To survey and monument a tract of land as shown on the accompanying map (being that portion of the tract of land described in deed recorded under O.R. 81-11766, lying East of the 1/16 section line).

EQUIPMENT:

Lietz Set 4 Total Station

PROCEDURE:

Survey monuments from Recorded Surveys #10635, #8239, and from the Survey of the Albert C. Meyer Subdivision were used in establishing the boundary of this parcel. In addition, survey monuments found along the South Line of Section 8, including the Southeast Corner of Section 8 which was recently re-established, were used to establish the South Line of this parcel.

The Southwest Corner of the parcel, being a 1/16 corner, was set on line halfway between the Southeast Corner of Section 8 and the South 1/4 corner of Section 8. The 1/16 corner is marked as shown on the accompanying plat and is referenced in the following manner: A 10" fir tree with a blaze facing the corner and a 3/4" brass tag with the stamped letters "BT" bears South 50° East, 9.55 feet to the center of the tree; a 15" fir tree with a blaze facing the corner and a 3/4" brass tag with the stamped letters "BT" bears South 20° West, 11.68 feet to the center of the tree; a 12" fir tree with a blaze facing the corner and a 3/4" brass tag with the stamped letters "BT" bears North 60° West, 16.38 feet to the center of the tree. A survey pin and cap which was found nearby was not used as the 1/16 corner since it was apparently set from a reference monument to the actual Section Corner (see RS8756).

The North Line of the parcel was established from found pins set to mark two boundary line agreements recorded under O.R. 80-01390 and O.R. 80-01391 (Official Records) Jackson County, Oregon. The most northerly corner of the parcel was set at a record bearing from the last pin found along the North Line of the parcel, and at the westerly right-of-way line of Granite Street which is shown on the plat of the Albert C. Meyer Subdivision.

The westerly right-of-way line was determined from centerline monuments in Granite Street.
