## SURVEY NARRATIVE TO COMPLY WITH PARAGRAPH 205.250 OREGON REVISED STATUTES

SURVEY FOR:

Landmark Surveying 205 West Ninth St. Medford, Oregon

LOCATION:

Southeast quarter of Section 30, Township 38 South, Range 1 East of the Willamette Meridian, Jackson

County, Oregon.

**PURPOSE:** 

To document, for public record, information gathered for determining the location of the Northwest corner of Donation Land Claim No. 45, T 38 S, R 1 E.


PROCEDURE: All evidence of the original monument and references for the northwest corner of Donation Land Claim No. 45 are evidently gone. In a survey for a county road by County Surveyor R.W. Kennedy in April, 1896, reference is made to the corner from a road intersection. (See Jackson County Road Records Volume 3, page 128). From the road intersection he set a pipe ". . which bears S  $59\frac{1}{2}$ ° W 52 links.". Filed Survey Narrative No. 3918 by Hurst in 1969 documents finding a pipe believed to be Kennedy's reference pipe. This pipe location was perpetuated by the County Surveyor's Office as shown in Filed Survey No. 11449.

In retracing Filed Survey No. 11449, many drafting and computational errors were found. These were verified by reviewing the field notes and computation sheets for County Surveyors Job File 88-61. Survey No. 3918 gave a tie to a  $\frac{1}{2}$ " pipe believed to be that referred to by A.T. Brown in the 1910 Surveys of County Roads 56 and 60. Brown refers also to setting an angle bar "... N 88° 07' E 30.0 ft." and "... iron pipe, Sta. 829+51.5". Both of these monuments were found. Using the distance of "36.5" given in Survey No. 3918 from the found 1" pipe, and holding Brown's distance of 20.0 foot from the angle bar a leasting was determined distance of 30.0 feet from the angle bar, a location was determined for Brown's 1910 road intersection. This location was verified by the distance northerly 464.36' to the found 1" road PI pipe (Brown's record distance = 464.5'). The position thus determined differs from the brass cap position southerly 0.91 feet, as shown on the map. I believe this to be a more accurate position than that marked by the brass cap monument.

It appears that the road intersection monumented by Brown differs from that surveyed by Kennedy in 1896. The Kennedy position was held and his tie to the northwest corner of Donation Land Claim No. 45 was used on this survey to mark the location of the DLC corner.
