Survey Narrative to comply with paragraph 209,250 O.R.S.

Survey for Troy Drexler.

FURFOSE: To survey the Hannaford tract, lying in the Northwest quarter of Section 36, T34S,RlE.,WM, lying South of the Butte Falls Road and to divide into seven parcels of land

IROCEEDURE: At the corner of Sections 25, 26, 35 and 36, I found a 1" iron pipe and four witness trees, corresponding to field notes and in fair shape. I took a solar observation and run due South 2659,14 feet and found a wooden hub, marked "1/4". There was one witness tree, in poor condition, being a 6" White Oak, bearing North 83° East 18 links; thence I run South 89042' East, along an established fence line, 2640 feet; I then proceeded to the South quarter corner of said Section 36 and found a stone monument and one witness tree being a White Oak bearing South 3° East 42 links. Thence I run North on a random line to the North quarter corner of said Section 36 and found a stake in a mound of stone. There were two witness trees, dorresponding to field notes, The blaze s were rotted. I de-termined the true course to be due North 5304.0 feet; thence I & run on a true line, North 89042' West 2636.0 feet to the Northwest corner of said Section 36.

The Northwest corner of the Hannaford tract was described as being a stone, 744 feet South and 716 feet East of the Northwest corner of said Section 36. I found a solid stone and drove a hole in it, placing therein a l inch pipe and my seal No. 838. These points were used as a base for the survey and monuments for the seven parcels were set, as shown

on the accompanying map.
