SURVEY NARRATIVE TO COMPLY WITH PARAGRAPH 209.250 OREGON REVISED STATUTES

SURVEY FOR:

City of Ashland

City Hall

20 East Main Street Ashland, Oregon 97520

LOCATION:

Situated in Government Lot 2 and the Southwest Quarter of the Northeast Quarter of Section 8, Township 39 South, Range 1 East of the Willamette Base and

Meridian, Jackson County, Oregon.

PURPOSE:

To survey and monument the revised right of way lines of STRAWBERRY LANE and secure a new deed from the existing property owner, Margaret J. Brown. Once the new right of way has been secured, the old deeded right of way, outside of the new alignment, will be vacated in order to clear up the title to Margaret J. Brown's property.

PROCEDURE:

The control for this survey was started from previously established points by Surveyor Swain many years ago, while in private surveying practice. A portion of this control line was re-surveyed to verify the accuracy of these control points. With that information established, proceeded to tie other survey monuments by both Surveyors Andrews P.L.S. 1626 and Kaiser P.L.S. 803. The boundary lines as established by Surveyor Andrews were a part of a "Judgment and Quiet Title Decree" by the Court and therefore were held as found with the resulting values shown against those of record. The monuments as set by Surveyor Kaiser, as shown hereon, were found to be in an acceptable position as related to this survey. Upon the final staking of the right of way lines, Margaret J. Brown was shown the location of the right of way monuments and indicated to this Surveyor that she approved the new location.

BASIS OF BEARING:

True Meridian at the North-South Centerline of Section 8, Township 39 South, Range 1 East as derived from the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (formerly Coast and Geodetic Survey) survey net established in 1968 and filed in the office of the Jackson County Surveyor.
