

SURVEYOR'S CERTIFICATE

STATE OF OREGON 355.

I, L.E. Ager a duly registered surveyor of the State of Oregon, being first duly sworn, do hereby certify that I have correctly surveyed and marked with proper monuments the tract of land hereon shown and the said plat is a correct representation of the survey made by me on the ground, that I planted a proper monument as provided by law, a two-inch by thirty-six inch galvanized iron pipe six inches below the surface of the ground indicating the initial point of said survey, and the following is an accurate description of the boundary lines: Commencing at the southwest Corner of Section 33, Township 35 South, Range 2 West of the Willamette Meridian, Jackson County, Oregon; thence North along the West line of said Section 671.67 feet; thence East at a right angle from said line 30.0 feet to the initial point of beginning; thence East at right angle from said line 860.0 feet; thence North, parallel with said line 603.33 feet; thence East at a right angle from said line 860.0 feet; thence North, parallel with said Section line 1907.22 feet; thence N.46°17 W. 588.85 feet to the southerly line of State Highway; thence along said line as follows: \$43°43'W. 652.0 feet; thence 5.46°17'E. 10.0 feet; thence S. 43°43'W. 565.81 feet to a point 30.0 feet East of said Section line; thence South, parallel with said line 2030.39 feet to the initial point of beginning.

Survey narrative to comply with Section 87-330, Oregon State Law of 1947

C. W. Duggan, Central Point, Oregon For:

Subdivision of portion Section 33, T.35 S., R. 2 W., W.M. Purpose:

Proceedure: Began survey at the southwest corner of Section 33, T.35 S., R.2 W., W.M., Jackson County, Oregon. This corner buried under road pavement (a 2 inch galvanized pipe) which is referenced for position by 2 iron pipes on the surface of the ground. From the record ties to the pipe at the Section corner from the reference points I set a nail in the pavement directly above the 2 inch pipe at the corner for start of survey.

> At the northwest corner of Section 33 which is marked with a stone 4" by 8" by 20" with cross on top which stone is set 2 feet below the surface of the ground and the position of which is tied in from 2 iron pipes and an oak tree at the ground surface. When measureing in from the reference pipes and oak tree according to the record distances and bearings to this stone I found a 2 inch iron pipe set at the surface of the ground directly over the corner stone.

I surveyed and marked a direct line from the southwest corner to the northwest corner of this section, the dist. from corner to corner being 5311.4 feet. At a point mid way I searched for the $\frac{1}{4}$ corner but all evidence of its position had been obliterated.

From the west line of this section the distances and angles from this line are as shown on the map and tracing of the Land Of Many Oaks Subdivision.
