Donation Land Claim No. 40 in the Northeast One/Quarter of Section 8 Township 39 South of Range 1 East of the Willamette Base and Meridian in Jackson County, Oregon.

To monument Boundary Line Agreements PURPOSE:

July 5, 1996 DATE: revised: October 25, 1996

BASIS of True Meridian at the East Line of Section 8 of said BEARINGS: Township and Range as derived from the 1968 Jackson County Surveyor's control network which utilized National Oceanic and Atmospheric geodetic survey monuments.

PROCEDURE: A thorough research of the public records revealed ambiguities in the retracement of the legal descriptions found. descriptions contain several latent ambiguities that appear to be the result of changes made to the original descriptions prepared in the late 1800's. The current descriptions contain different units of measurement as well as different relative positional tolerances. these descriptions utilized the 1883 Map of Ashland, as opposed to the later Official 1888 Map of the City of Ashland (this part of Ashland was left off the 1888 Map despite being shown on the 1867, 1879, and I suspect that even the original descriptions were in 1883 maps.) conflict with one another, as they may have been prepared by different early surveyors as well as being affected by changes in the early mapping of the town of Ashland. The first "Official" Map of Ashland was done in 1867 by B.F. Myer, the subsequent "Official" Maps of 1879, 1883, and 1888 were done by City Surveyor, M.L. McCall. Regardless the current land owners were appraised of the situation and Boundary Line Agreements were felt to be the most equitable solution. Several old "3/8 inch iron pipes" have been recovered by recent surveys, some of the 3/8 pipes were shown in filed survey No.6405 as well as one recovered in the performance of this survey (it is located on the Northwesterly right of way of Pine Street). Though several have been obliterated subsequent to f.s. 6405 their computed locations Though their origin is were utilized according to said survey. unknown and the remaining monuments are badly corroded, undisturbed location provides the best evidence of the boundaries of these tracts as established at a much earlier date. Therefore the location of the set 1/2" X 24" iron pipe for a boundary line agreement monument perpetuates one of these obliterated 3/8 inch monuments as shown on f.s. 6405 and existing improvements controlled the direction of the Boundary Lines by Agreement.
