Donation Land Claim No.38 in the

Southwest One/Quarter of Section 23, Township 38 South of Range 4 West of the Willamette Base and Meridian

in Jackson County, Oregon.

PURPOSE:

To establish property corner monuments and mark the boundary lines as set forth in Document No.92-27573 of

the Official Records of Jackson County, Oregon.

BASIS of

BEARINGS: True Meridian at Station A-72 (being a mining railroad spike 4 inches below the pavement of Highway 238) with a reference backsight to Station A-73 (being a 5/8 inch iron rod 6" deep on the southwesterly shoulder of Highway 238). These stations are part of the Jackson County Surveyor's A.M.S. geodetic control network. The Oregon State Plane coordinate conversion was determined from the 1983 North American Datum (the theta angle equaling a negative 1 degree 48 minutes and 50.7 seconds).

PROCEDURE: A thorough research of the public records revealed no retracement of the South Line of Donation Land Claim No. 38. Furthermore there have been no re-establishment surveys for the Claim's Southeast corner on file with the Jackson County Surveyor's Office. The original 1857 notes of David P. Thompson's (General Land Office Deputy Surveyor, Contract No.70) Survey of the Donation Land Claim indicate the corner was originally established on an island in the Applegate River. Subsequent to and at this same time there was extensive placer mining operations on the Applegate River that could have easily obliterated this corner monument(as well as extensive flooding). As the accuracy of Thompson's original survey is acceptable for the time and standardization, that there is no island at this time or in this location of the Applegate River, that the other topographical calls made by Thompson when available were consistent with found features today, then the re-establishment of this corner monument would require a dependent resurvey of the partire of the pa

pertinent remaining original monuments.

A GRANT BOUNDARY ADJUSTMENT was utilized (following the 1973 Manual of Instructions for the Survey of Public Lands) to adjust for the differing retraced distances and bearings. An index factor of 1.01893 was determined relative to Surveyor Thompson 1857 distances when retracing his Survey of the East and South Boundaries of Donation Land Claim No.38 and Government Record angle was held as per Thompson bearings. As the current location of the Southeast corner of Donation Land Claim No.38 falls in a homeowner's backyard no monument was set.

Land Claim No.38 falls in a homeowner's backyard no monument was set. Witness corner monuments were set at the top of the steep Southwest bank of the Applegate River as any points beyond were impractical for corner monument establishment.
