LOCATION:

Donation Land Claim No. 40 in the Northeast One/Quarter of Section 8 Township 39 South of Range 1 East of the Willamette Base and Meridian in Jackson County, Oregon.

PURPOSE:

To monument a Boundary Line Agreement recorded as

Document No.97-15255 of the Official Records of Jackson

County, Oregon.

DATE:

April 15, 1997

BASIS of

True Meridian at the East Line of Section 8 of said Township and Range as derived from the 1968 Jackson County Surveyor's **BEARINGS:** control network which utilized National Oceanic and Atmospheric geodetic survey monuments.

PROCEDURE: A thorough research of the public records revealed ambiguities in the retracement of the legal descriptions found. descriptions contain several latent ambiguities that appear to be the result of changes made to the original descriptions prepared in the late 1800's. The current descriptions contain different units of measurement as well as different relative positional tolerances. Also these descriptions utilized the 1883 Map of Ashland, as opposed to the later Official 1888 Map of the City of Ashland (this part of Ashland was left off the 1888 Map despite being shown on the 1867, 1879, and

As my client's tracts were segregated from one of these early 1883 maps.) ambiguous parent conveyances (J.R. Helman to Jacob Thompson on July 25, 1868 Vol.4 Page 702 D.R.J.Co.), these tracts as described do not reflect the lines of occupation that have been established over the The Helman to Thompson tract is shown on the 1879 Map of Ashland, one of the very early conveyances in Ashland. However, the "Church Lot" and Block 8 of the City of Ashland were conveyed even earlier and are senior (they are shown without the Helman to Thompson tract on B.F. Myers 1867 Map of Ashland, as well). Therefore a Boundary Line Agreement was felt to be the most equitable solution, as the difference between the various early maps of Ashland and the subsequent changes made to these descriptions only creates further confusion. Therefore, the residences on the Stark's property were

used to control the Boundary Line Agreement.

The Pine Street right of way was controlled by the City of Ashland street centerline monumentation. The old "3/8 inch iron pipes" that were recovered in Filed Survey No.15163 were not used to control the right of way as there appears to be a small discrepancy relative to

the centerline monumentation.
