However, even this fence takes a substantial swing to the East and back North and ultimately joins the fence along the diagonal 1/16th line there after heading in a Southesterly direction until it terminates at the Sampson Creek Road! Northerly it appears to stay close but follows the path of least resistance around rock bluffs and outcrops and unfortunately the deed line is 165.00 feet further East.

#### SURVEY MONUMENT DESCRIPTION

(All distances to bearing trees are measured to a 40d spike placed side-center at the root crown and all bearings are measured to a tack and brass washer at the top of the bearing tree blaze, unless otherwise noted.)

CENTER ONE/QUARTER CORNER COMMON TO SECTION 28
Township 39 South of Range 2 East Willamette Base & Meridian.
set: a 2.5 inch bronze disk on a 2 inch by 32 inch galvanized iron
pipe, exposed 4 inches in a mound of stones, firmly set and marked:
"T39S R2E S28 C1/4 1996 LS 2057" from which:

A 5/8 inch by 30 inch iron rebar with a yellow plastic cap, exposed 4 inches, firmly set and marked: "STEWART LS 2057" bears N 37°25'E, 25.47 feet distant.

A 5/8 inch by 30 inch iron rebar with a yellow plastic cap, exposed 5 inches, firmly set and marked: "STEWART LS 2057" bears S 21° 20'E, 32.15 feet distant.

An 8" d.b.h. White Oak bears S 37° 28'W, 17.11 feet distant which I scribed "C1/4 S28 BT" with brass washer and tack at the top of the single blaze.

A 26" d.b.h. Black Oak bears N 21° 28'W, 23.69 feet distant which I scribed "C1/4 S28 BT" with brass washer and tack at the top of the single blaze.

SOUTH ONE/SIXTEENTH CORNER COMMON TO SECTIONS 27 & 28
Township 39 South of Range 2 East Willamette Base & Meridian.
set: a 2.5 inch bronze disk on a 2 inch by 32 inch galvanized iron
pipe, exposed 3 inches in a mound of stones, firmly set and marked:
"T39S R2E S28 S27 S.1/16 1995 LS 2057" from which:

A 1/2 inch by 24 inch iron rebar with a red plastic cap, flush with the ground surface, firmly set and marked: "STEWART LS 2057" bears N  $63^{\circ}32'$   $52^{\circ}W$ , 304.17 feet distant.

A 24.3" d.b.h. White Oak bears N  $69^{\circ}55^{\circ}E$ , 73.33 feet distant which I scribed "S1/16 S27 BT" with brass washer and tack at the top of a single blaze.

proportioned location. It should be noted that there had been extensive clearing and reconstruction of the fences in the area of the Section corner and the current fences probably do not reflect historical fence locations. Finally an entry was found in a field book of an early city engineer for Ashland named Frank Walker. Walker's Field Book "G" page 17 (dated June 1910) shows a corner location for this Section Corner. However the only reference is to the 1854 location for the single original bearing tree referencing this Section Corner. There were no further notes or comments other than "mound of stones" once again in reference to the 1854 description for this Section Corner. After extensive searching for this location over a four year period the corner was deemed lost and was re-established according to the 1973 Manual of Instruction for the Survey of Public Lands and is shown and described on the Beaton-Jefferey Subdivision Plat. Soon after the re-establishment of this Section Corner the Sectional subdivision of Section 28 was begun to establish the boundaries of the Hutchinson tract. These subdivisional lines were held and were used to intersect the boundary of the Emigrant Creek Reservoir. The overall mathematical closure of the U.S.B.R. Map of 1958 (as additionally set forth in Volume 471 Page 81 of the Deed Records of Jackson County, Oregon) was very good and short of a bearing rotation it's dimensions were held. Unfortunately, we have yet to discover any monumentation or evidence of this survey other than the Southeast Section Corner of Section 28 (common to Sections 27,28,33,&34) which was presumably used as it was in existence in 1958 and is shown on the 1958 Bureau of Reclamation Map.

The Davalos parcels were surveyed during a later stage of the Hutchinson survey as the easement to the Hutchinson ownership is along the Northeasterly line of the Davalos fee title. Both parties were very interested in the boundaries of the Emigrant Creek Reservoir which for now are only monumented on the Davalos ownership. Filed Survey No.12277, a Partition Plat, was done without establishing the Section line common to Sections 27 & 28. The 1/4 corner and Section corner were established subsequently and are shown on my Partition Plat in Section 27 (Filed Survey No.12469). As the only control for Filed Survey No.12277 was done by Surveyor Ager (Ager did not establish the Section Line either), it was felt that the intent of Surveyor McMahan was to establish Witness Corners for Parcel No.2 of his Partition of the Davalos property. That survey did not set monumentation for any of the corners of Parcel 1, part of which is monumented on this survey.

The resultant gap along Hutchinson's East Boundary line for whatever reason appears to be intentional. The original 11 rod strip conveyed by Austie (Barron) Brown to M.M. Tucker in 1917 was apparently a "cattle lane". In 1942 M.M. Tucker conveys to an apparent heir W.G. Tucker only 10 rods, an apparent "typo". However, W.G. Tucker again conveys only 10 rods to W.L. Davis in 1947 (Vol.281 Page 54 Deed Records Jackson Co.) An attempt was made to track the heirs of M.M. Tucker. However, no local land owners of long standing recall or remember anything of this individual (or any relatives) and thus far no heirs have been found.

Finally, the fences in this area were not shown because with only one exception they do not conform to any Deed lines established by a proper survey. Because of the steep terrain and exposed rock outcrops it appears the fence locations are put where it is feasible to set fence posts or wander from tree to tree. The fence locations along the Reservoir Boundary seem to conform to road locations and high water lines but are hundreds of feet away from the surveyed Deed lines. The notable exception is at the Center 1/4 corner of Section 28. This corner falls close to the East side of a North-South fence

PROCEDURE: A thorough research of public records and private survey files revealed little evidence of the original surveys in Section 28. A map provided by Talent Irrigation District which was dated August 19, 1958 by the Talent Division of the Bureau of Reclamation showed several 1/4 corner and section corner locations, however the North 1/4 corner which was re-established from original evidence by the Jackson County Surveyor's Office is not shown. Also the Section corner common to Sections 20, 21, 22, is shown belower there has never been to Sections 20, 21, 28, & 29 is shown, however there has never been any monumentation or accessory evidence found. Accordingly, the ties to these locations were evaluated and diligently searched for with negative results. Our firm was retained by the developers of the Beaton-Jefferey Subdivision (filed survey 14227) to re-establish this Section Corner in 1994.

In 1990 and 1991 an extensive control network had been established by this firm for the Sectional subdivision of the adjoining Section 27 (as shown on filed survey No.12469). This network proportioned the location of this Section Corner to determine the proportioned location of the Section Corner to the East (Section corner common to Sections 21, 22, 27, & 28). At that time (1990-1991) we conducted a search of the area surrounding both of these Section Corner locations for any monumentation or accessory evidence with negative results. Subsequent to this a search utilizing the 1958 U.S.B.R. Map's location of the Section corner common to Sections 20, 21, 28,& 29 was done in 1994. This location was calculated to fall 8 feet further North than the current proportioned location for this section corner. The U.S. Bureau of Reclamation location was staked out late in 1994 prior to re-establishment of this Section Corner. Again a search was conducted, in conjunction with the Jackson County Surveyor's Office and again with negative results. Surveyor Burrell (PLS 638) being the surveyor of record for the Beaton-Jeffrey Subdivision suggested that perhaps a fence corner location had been used by the government survey crews in 1958 so all fence post locations were evaluated as well. The resultant fence corner location correlated poorly with either the 1958 location or the Page 1 of 3
