


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An electrical ground rod was found near a power pole at the Southwest corner of property proposed to be conveyed which appears to have hen mistaken for the "3/4" I. rod" shown on said R/W map 114/6. There is also a 4" x 4" wood R/W post located approximately 1 meter (3.28 feet) Westerly from the ground rod. Since the 3/4" I. rod could not be located (it appears as though the 3/4" I. rod could have been destroyed by power pole installation) we tied several existing 3/4" I. rod R/W monuments and using the State co-ordinates for said rods shown on said R/W map 114/6 we computed the location for the missing rod and replaced it with our 5/8" x 24" rebar/plastic cap.

PURPOSE:

Monument and describe a portion of tract described in Volume 185, page 263 D.R. proposed to be conveyed.

PROCEDURE:

The East boundary of the subject

property is the West boundary of East-half of the SW % of Section 10. Made field ties to sectional corners as required to compute this boundary as shown on the accompanying map.

The Northwesterly boundary was picked on the ground by O.D.O.T. personnel. Since the subject property is owned by the State, the right-of-way line shown on the most current State right-of-way map (rolled map No. 114/6 in the Office of the County Surveyor, O.D.O.T. Map No. "Part 2 of 2 9B-26-20") is shown to be the Southerly and Easterly boundaries of said tract described in Volume 185, page 263 D.R.. The new boundary being created to define the portion of tract described in Vol. 185, page 263 D.R. which is being sold is the Northwesterly boundary which was picked on the ground by O.D.O.T. personnel.

The Southerly boundary is the Southerly boundary of said tract described in Vol. 185, page 263 D.R.. A 3/4" O.D.O.T. iron pin was found for control for the Southeast corner.
