CORNER POINTS ACCEPTED FOR CONTROL:

One-quarter corner to Sections 16 and 17, Township 38 South, Range 1 West, Willamette Meridian.

At the corner point I found a Brass disk encased in a standard street monument case 8 inches below the road surface of Camp Baker Road. The position of this monument was verified from the accessories described in the Third Reestablishment Documentation on file with the Jackson County surveyor.

One-quarter corner to Sections 17 and 18, Township 38 South, Range 1 West, Willamette Meridian.

At the corner point I found a standard Jackson County Surveyor brass cap and 1 inch diameter galvanized iron post. The monument extends 8 inches above the ground surface. The position of this monument was verified from the accessories described in the Third re-establishment corner documentation on file with the Jackson County Surveyor.



SURVEY NARRATIVE TO COMPLY WITH PARAGRAPH 209.250 OREGON REVISED STATUTES

SURVEY FOR:

Ms. Pauline Modar 2917 Camp Baker Rd. Medford, Or. 97501

LOCATION:

Southwest one-quarter of Section 17, Township 38 South, Range 1 West, Willamette Meridian, Jackson Co., Or.

BASIS OF BEARING:

East -West centerline of Section 17 per Record Survey No. 1534.

PURPOSE:

To monument the corner points of the parcel described within Deed Document No. 91-21068 as shown on the attached Map of Survey and to determine the position of a board fence and mobile home situated along the east property line.

PROCEDURE:

Utilizing the deed description furnished by Ms. Modar and record of survey maps on file with the Jackson County Surveyor, I performed a search for previously established monuments. I recovered the east and west one-quarter corner monuments for Sections 17. I also recovered monuments established by Surveyor Mark E. Boyden, PLS No. 281 during record surveys 1534, 2403 and 14896.

Utilizing the recovered monuments I performed a survey traverse tying the monuments, I then established the corner point monuments as shown on the attached Map of Survey.
