

was also set by A.T. Brown for the Northeast corner of the subject property which has been destroyed by irrigation canal construction. A.T. Brown's record position for this corner was located at his record distance North from the most Northerly found sandstone (111.60 feet) and on A.T. Brown's bearing rotated 0° 09' 37" counterclockwise, the bearing rotation developed between the found sandstones.

The Northerly boundary was located per Filed Survey No. 3605 and the A.T. Brown survey.

The M.I.D. canal is shown as surveyed on Filed Survey No. 3330 and is indicated as an exception in Inst. No. 95-19401 D.R. from the subject property. Also see Jackson County Miscellaneous Records Vol. 215, page 1.

Found monuments shown on the accompanying map set on SPLENDOR VIEW SUBD. EXT. NO. 1 and Filed Survey No. 3330 were accepted for control for the Southerly property line. Found the 2" I. pipe in poor condition at the Northeast corner of Lot 1, SPLENDOR VIEW SUBD., which was ignored.

The Westerly boundary was located from found sandstone monuments set in 1915 by A.T. Brown on his survey of the HEIMROTH RANCH. A partial record of this survey is found in Book "A", 1912 to 1924 at page 92 in the County Surveyor's Office. Much of the survey is omitted. A better record was found in Surveyor Mark E. Boyden's private records. A stone
