

There are two sections of the subject tract boundary where there are major closure problems on the Deeds of Record and also conflicts with adjoining deeds, see note on accompanying mag. Boundary line agreements with adjoining property owners are suggested in these areas. Portions of the subject tract boundary running along sectional subdivision boundaries were located from found controlling monuments shown on the map. The monument set for the Northeast corner of Section 23 on Filed Survey No. 5661 was not recovered, consequently a position for the East-onesixteenth corner on the North boundary of Sections 23 was calculated from information on said survey.

At the South one-sixteenth corner common to Sections 23 and 24 set a 1"x36" galvanized iron pipe with plastic cap exposed 12" from which:

- A 5" white oak scribed "S 1/16-BT" bears S 13° 36' W, 5.8'
- A 7" white oak scribed "S 1/16-BT" bears N 45° 18' W, 6.5'
- A fence corner, fences N-S-W bears S 82° 37' W, 37.7'

PURPOSE:

PROCEDURE:

Found monuments shown on the

accompanying map were tied via closed loop EDM Traverses.

A portion of the Northwesterly boundary was previously monumented on an unrecorded survey by L.E. Ager (see map legend). Some of these unrecorded monuments have been used on Filed Survey No. 5668 and all are located on existing improvement lines. Survey No. 5668 indicates an offset from the Ager Monuments to "Deed Record Position", even though existing monuments were obviously used for boundary control on the survey. The bearings and distances shown on the Ager Survey agree with the bearings and distances on this portion of the subject tract boundary as described in Inst. No. 87-10464 O.R.

A portion of the Easterly boundary was monumented on Filed Survey Nos. 5048 and 5391. These surveys also agree with the subject tract description recorded in Inst. No. 87-1Ø464 O.R.
