

Monument and mark boundary lines for fencing that portion of the North

described in Inst. No. 76-06058 O.R. bordering on the State of Oregon property described in Vol. 186, page 120 D.R. and Vol. 262, page 52 D.R.

PROCEDURE:

The tracts described in Vol. 112,

page 11 and Vol. 186, page 120 were located per their respective deed calls. State of Oregon right-of-way metal posts were found along the Southerly boundary of said tract described in Vol. 186, page 120 where said boundary coincides with the Northerly boundary of tract described in Inst. No. 76-Ø6Ø58 O.R.

O.D.O.T. was contacted several times in an attempt to receive any survey information they may have regarding boundaries of said tracts described in Vol. 186, page  $12\emptyset$ D.R. and especially Vol. 262, page 52 D.R. to no avail. 5/8" rebars were found alongside state right-of-way metal posts at the Northeast corner and at the angle point on the Easterly boundary of said tract described in Vol. 262, page 52 D.R. These monuments agree favorably with the improvement line
