
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SURVEY NARRATIVE TO COMPLY WITH PARAGRAPH 209.250, OREGON REVISED STATUTES

LOCATION:

A portion of Lot 4, Block 28 of the City of Ashland, in the Southeast 1/4 of Section 5, and the Southwest 1/4 of Section 4, Township 39 South, Range 1 East of the Willamette Meridian & Base, Jackson County, Oregon.

PURPOSE:

To survey and monument the client's property as described in document number 90-30566, Official Records, Jackson County, Oregon.


BASIS OF BEARINGS:

Found monuments on the centerline of Laurel Street, between Van Ness Street and Central Avenue as shown on Filed Survey No. 5657.

PROCEDURE:

Block 28 of the City of Ashland was retraced by Everett Swain in 1974 as Filed Survey number 5657. At that time, there existed two centerline monuments along North Main Street that have since been either removed or paved over. Without these monuments, I was unable to verify the measured distance along Central Avenue that was used to determine the proportioned distances along the southwesterly line of Block 28. Since my measurements to the remaining centerline monuments matched very closely with Mr. Swain's measurements, I used his proportioned distance along Central Avenue, together with proportioned distances along Van Ness Street, to establish the northwesterly line of the subject property. I had previously established the southwesterly line of the parcel during Filed Survey No. 16555. The property description called to the southwesterly line of Volume 191, Page 537, Deed Records, and record dimensions from that deed were held to establish the northeasterly line of the parcel.

I found several iron pins around the parcel. There is no filed survey that shows these pins and, because of the material used and their random locations, I suspect they were not set by a surveyor. The fences however, generally conform to these pins. I did not use them in determining the property boundaries, although there may be claims of ownership due to occupation.
