

SURVEY NARRATIVE TO COMPLY WITH PARAGRAPH 209.250 OREGON REVISED STATUTES

Location:

The Northeast One-Quarter (1/4) of Section 29, Township 38 South, Range 3 West,

Willamette Meridian, Jackson County, Oregon

Purpose:

To survey and monument a strip of land situated between the North bank of the Applegate River and the South right-of-way line of Highway 238, being a portion of that land described in Instrument No. 91-05996, Official Records, Jackson County,

Oregon

Procedure: Control established by this office to accomplish Survey No. 12370 was extended by traverse utilizing a Leica TCA 1800 Total Station. Highway right-of-way pins, which were set by the Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) per ODOT Drawing No. 8B-2-20, on file in the Office of the Jackson County Surveyor, were tied and found to be in good position. The "point of commencement" of Deed Instrument No. 91-05996 is an iron pin located on the Southerly right-of-way line of Hwy. 238 at Hwy. Station 106+82.70. A search for this pin uncovered a buried sprinkler system. There is a possibility that this pin as been removed. I, therefore, computed a location based on the found right-of-way monuments and then determined the position of the deed corners on the Southerly right-of-way line.


I next reviewed Deed Instrument No. 89-30396 which begins at the same iron pin on the Southerly right-of-way line of Hwy. 238 and then goes Northwesterly 95.00 feet and then calls South 6° 10' West 177.4 feet "to an iron pin in the north bank of an irrigation ditch". I located a 1 inch iron pin in the North bank of the irrigation ditch and measured a bearing and distance of South 08° 26' 27" West 184.77 feet versus the deed bearing and distance of South 06° 10' West 177.4 feet. According to deed description there was, at one time, an iron pin located South 06° 10' West 140 feet from the pin in the irrigation bank. The second pin was probably destroyed by the 1997 flood. I accepted the found 1 inch iron pin as being the best evidence of the intended bearing orientation for the property being surveyed and applied the difference between the deed and record bearings to compute the direction of the property lines as shown on the attached map. This computed alignment agrees reasonably well with the alignment of the existing fence line.
