SURVEY NARRATIVE TO COMPLY WITH PARAGRAPH 209.250 OREGON REVISED STATUTES

SURVEY FOR:

David and Victoria Weldon 2645 Thompson Creek Road Applegate OR. 97530

LOCATION:

Northeast one-quarter Section 32 and Northwest one-quarter Section 33, Township 38 South, Range 4 West, W.M., Jackson County, Oregon

PURPOSE:

To survey and establish corner point monuments for the lands described in Document 00-03510 of the deed records of Jackson County.

PROCEDURE:

I began this survey with a review of the deed and previous survey records controlling the location of this property. Land situated within Section 32 was divided by Surveyor Verlyn Thomas, L.S. No. 505 circa 1967-1970. Subsequent surveys and ownership changes modified the parcels from the original configuration as surveyed by Thomas. Parcels are described from the survey originally performed by Thomas.

Portions of the property are situated within the Northwest one-quarter of Section 33 and are controlled by the Thomas survey on the west and the section subdivision lines to the north and east. The Bureau of Land Management had performed a subdivision of Section 33 in 1995. The survey established monuments controlling the east line. I performed a survey tie to the monuments controlling this line and utilized the BLM survey plat to compute a position for the Northwest one-sixteenth corner of section. I then computed the position for the subject property corners situated along the section subdivision line.

BASIS OF BEARING:

The basis of bearing utilized for this survey is the line between recovered monuments established by Surveyor Thomas during SN 4337. Monuments utilized are noted on the Record of Survey Map.

Equipment utilized in this survey:

A Nikon DTM 420 Total Station and related equipment.
