

line of the 15 foot wide road along the westerly boundary of Crestbrook Orchards Tracts was established using procedure followed in survey number 1345, (which used the plat record distance west of the line from the northeast corner of section 28 to the southeast corner of DLC 61, along the southerly line of Hillcrest Road). Doing this creates triangular apparent deed gap between the westerly boundary line of DLC 61 and the above mentioned westerly road line, that ranges from a point at the southwest corner of DLC 61 to 17.80 feet wide at the north line of Section 28

Rogue Valley Estates Subdivision:

The easterly boundary line of Block 1 of Rogue Valley Estates Subdivision was held as a line 40 feet westerly of, and parallel with, the westerly boundary line of DLC 61. The northerly line of Block 1 was held as a line 50 feet southerly of, and parallel with, the northerly section line of section 28. The delta for the curve forming the northeasterly corner of Lot 9 does not match record, and the 40 foot record radius was held. Survey Number 12877 found original monuments along the northerly line of Block 1 that matched record distance from the Initial Point, and likewise set monuments per record. None of those original monuments were found on this survey, but a monument set on Survey Number 12877 was found on the westerly boundary line of Lot 8 as shown.

Blocks 1-3-4 of Bel Air Heights, (1960), and Survey Number 933, (1956), show this section of North Phoenix Road and Cherry Lane as existing, with no origin cited. A road by petition was viewed in 1869, with a portion thereof amended in 1879, this being superseded by a petition in 1910, ("Road #42 Hillcrest to Phoenix"), which appears to be the latest solid record of the location and creation of this portion of the road, (no width or curve information given). The centerline tangent per the 1910 petition was held as a line from the northeast corner of Section 28 to a found ½" iron pipe, as shown. According to Dale Petrasek of the Jackson County Public Roads and Parks Department, when no width is given on a road petition, 60 feet is the accepted value. The above procedure was used to determine the location of Urano Lane, and the westerly right-of-way line for use in writing the description of the right-of-way acquisition to the west as conveyed to the City in Instrument Number 01-32564, Jackson County Official Records.

Right-of-way acquisitions along the easterly line of the road were written to the road as shown on the subdivision plat for the Resubdivision of Blocks 1, 3, & 4 Bel Air Heights, as established by Survey Number 12901, as shown. Record values from said subdivision were used to reestablish Lots 9 through 14, and monuments were set at the intersection of the new right-of-way line and the sidelines of Lot 12 The location of the new easterly right-of-way, from the north line of Country Club Village, South Village, to the south end of this survey, was based on the existing westerly curb and the width of right-of-way needed to accommodate the planned improvements. Fragments of needed right-of-way from Lots 9, 10, 12, 13, and 14, Block 1 of the Resubdivision of Blocks 1-3-4 of Bel Air Heights, were acquired accordingly.

Foothill Road:

North of Hillcrest, the centerline of Foothill Road was established by holding the position of the bolt in Lone Pine Road shown as "set" on survey number 3995, and two found spikes, (as shown on Jackson County Road Department field notes in January of 1953, and found on survey number 3995 as lying on the County alignment established in 1938).

South of Hillcrest, the 40 foot wide strip created for Foothill Road on the plat of Rogue Valley Estates Subdivision was established as adjoining the westerly boundary line of Donation Land Claim, (DLC), number 61, as shown. The westerly boundary

LOCATION:

The northwest quarter of Section 27, the northeast quarter of Section 28, and the southeast quarter of Section 21, in Township 37 South, Range 1 West of the Willamette Base and Meridian, in the City of Medford.

PURPOSE:

To monument the realignment of North Phoenix Road with Foothill Road.

BASIS OF BEARINGS:

Oregon Coordinate System of 1983, South Zone, bearing along the north line of the northeast quarter of Section 28 in Township 37 South, Range 1 West of the Willamette Base and Meridian.

PROCEDURE:

Preliminary field work for this survey was performed in 2001. Monuments were set between 2003 and 2007.

Old North Phoenix Road from Hillcrest Road to 1000 feet south, (now Urano Lane), also continuing south to the westerly line of DLC 58:

Chain of Title research summarized by Jackson County Title in their Special Report Number 98477 in April 2001, reveals inconclusive title authority creating this section of North Phoenix Road. The plat for Crestbrook Orchards Tracts, 1909, is indeterminate in it's designation of the widths or extent of dedicated right-of-way along the easterly line of section 28.
