

accepts the 5/8" iron pin set by Hurst and the found 3/4" iron pipe on the south end of the line as the westerly boundary of Volume 292, Page 362. His outer boundary description calls to the west line of Volume 427, Page 59.

In 1978, surveyor Verlyn Thomas surveys the easterly line of The Old Helman Ranch Subdivision and holds the 3/4" iron pipe at the southeast corner of Lynn Estates at the projected south end of the line and the 5/8" iron pin (described as a 5/8" iron bolt) set by Hurst at the north end of the line. Mr Thomas fails to call out the westerly line of Vol. 427, Page 59 in his outer boundary description but is clearly following Mr. Hurst and Mr. Ager's work. In June of 2000, surveyor Everett Swain surveys the northerly line of Tract A as noted above. He sets a pin to monument the northwest corner of Volume 296, Page 362 at record distance from the northeast corner of the aforementioned Tract A and another pin at the extension of the line defined by Mr. Hurst. He shows a gap between the west line of Volume 296, Page 362 and the east lines of The Old Helman Ranch and Lynn Estates subdivisions. I do not believe this gap actually exists. I believe the evidence indicates that the line defined by the monuments set along said easterly line of the Old Helman Ranch and Lynn Estates subdivisions is, in fact, the westerly line of Volume 296, Page 362 and Volume 427, Page 59. It is also noteworthy that the property description contained in Volume 296, Page 362 does not close by approximately 3.5 feet. The most probable location for the error is in the length of the course which Mr. Swain held for distance.

LOCATION:

Located in the Northwest Quarter of Section 4, Township 39 South, Range 1 East, Willamette Base and Meridian, Jackson County, Oregon.

PURPOSE:

To provide a boundary survey and legal descriptions for annexation of two parcels and two partial parcels into the City of Ashland as approved by City of Ashland Ordinance No. 2968.

BASIS OF BEARINGS:

True meridian at the north-south centerline of Section 4 as derived from the N.O.A.A. survey net on file in the office of the Jackson County Surveyor. The reference line for bearing control for this survey is the line between the northwest corner of Donation Land Claim No. 53 and the Ell corner of Donation Land Claim no 41, as shown on Filed Surveys No. 5576 and 16744.

PROCEDURE:

The parcels to be annexed have been divided into three tracts for the purpose of annexation. The line between Tracts B and C is not a legal parcel line at this time but will be created in a subsequent property line adjustment.

The easterly and northerly lines of Tract B follow the center of Ashland Creek which was surveyed by this firm in 2007. The westerly line of Tracts C and B and the easterly and northerly lines of Tract A were defined and monumented by surveyor Everett Swain in his survey for the City of Ashland (No. 16744). Said Survey No. 16744 shows a deed record gap, approximately 3.5 feet wide, along the westerly line of Tract A. Research by this firm indicates that no deed record gap exists; the following being a brief history of the line:

Volume 244, Page 143, T.E. Fowler and Ruth Fowler are granted the parent tract (1943). Volume 292, Page 362, the line is created when the Fowlers grant a portion of their property to Rogue Valley Broadcasting, Inc. (1948).

Volume 427, Page 59, Rogue Valley Broadcasting, Inc. grant their parcel to Blackburn-Hamilton Investment Corp.

In 1964, surveyor Charles Hurst is hired by T.E. Fowler to define a 10 acre tract on the west side of the line (Survey No. 2509). This tract is the future Lynn Estates Subdivision and the Old Helman Ranch Subdivision. Along the east line, Mr. Hurst finds a 3/4" iron pipe on the south end and a 1" iron pipe on a northerly extension of the line. Mr. Hurst records in his Narrative that Mr. Fowler claimed the monuments were set along said westerly line of Volume 427, Page 59, at the time the tract was first conveyed. Mr. Hurst holds the monuments as defining the line and sets a pin along the line a the northeast corner of the 10 acre tract. In 1965, surveyor L.E. Ager surveys and creates Lynn Estates and, along the easterly line,
