

LOCATION:

Located in the Northwest Quarter of Section 2, Township 39 South, Range 1 West, Willamette Base and Meridian, Jackson County, Oregon.

PURPOSE:

To adjust a boundary with a neighboring parcel as approved by Jackson County Planning, File No. SUB2007-0.

BASIS OF BEARINGS:

The deed record bearing of the south line of parcel described in Document No. 87-18444, Official Records, Jackson County, Oregon, as surveyed and monumented by L.E. Ager in 1965.

PROCEDURE:

The legal descriptions for these parcels describe a "concrete monument" thirty feet south of the interior ell corner of DLC No. 37. We found no records to indicate that the ell corner had ever been recovered or replaced. The client, however, produced a copy of an unrecorded survey done by Mark Boyden in 1993. This survey noted a 5/8" iron pin set by L.E. Ager at the ell corner location with a caveat saying that the position of the corner was under review by the County Surveyor. The survey also showed the concrete monument 30 feet south of the iron pin and a tie to the southwest corner of DLC No. 37 (also set by Ager and with the same caveat). We recovered the concrete monument and the 5/8" iron pin set for the ell corner but we were unable to find the pipe which was set for the southwest corner of the Donation Land Claim. went back through the history of the parcels in question and noted that they were created by metes and bounds descriptions in 1965. We then went to Mark Boyden's office and looked through Mr. Ager's field notes from 1965. We found a survey done by Mr. Ager that suggested he set iron pins along the Wagner Creek Road frontage of the parcels. With this information, we were able to recover a 5/8" iron pin at the end of a curve along the northerly line of the parcel described in Document No. 98-19022. We were unable to find any additional corners set by Mr. Ager in the course of his survey. The legal descriptions appear to have been written and recorded after the survey was completed and the found monuments are the best evidence we could find to retrace the survey.
