



LOCATION:

Located in the City of Ashland, in the Southeast Quarter of Section 8 and the Northeast Quarter of Section 17, Township 39 South, Range 1 East, Willamette Base and Meridian, Jackson County, Oregon.

PURPOSE:

To survey and monument a tract which contains four separate tax lots.

BASIS OF BEARINGS:

The reference line for bearing control for this survey was taken from monuments found on the south line of Section 8 as shown on Filed Survey No. 13976.

PROCEDURE:

Our client was proposing to purchase the four tax lots in question and desired to have the lines of the lots clearly marked and the corners of the lots found or, if necessary, re-set. The parcel corners had all been previously established in the course of three separate surveys; the two northerly tax lots comprise Parcel B of Partition Plat P-44-1994 (Survey No. 13976), the southeasterly tax lot is Lot 13 of Lithia Creek Estates, A Planned Community (Survey No. 16279), and the remaining tax lot is part of Survey No. 8756.

Survey No. 8756 was filed in 1981 by surveyor John Pierson. The north line of the survey is the north line of Section 17. At the time of that survey, the northeast corner of Section 17 had just been re-established by surveyor Everett Swain. In his Narrative, Mr. Pierson discusses his decision to accept an older iron pipe which was found southerly of the new corner as the true Section Corner. In 1994, while surveying the boundaries of what was to be Partition Plat P-44-1994, I had occasion to survey the same north line of Section 17. After reviewing Mr. Swain's notes on the re-establishment of the Section Corner, I felt he made a good case for not accepting the aforesaid older iron pipe. Holding Swain's Section Corner, I proceeded to set monuments along the north Line of Section 17; including the northwest 1/16 corner. This resulted in a survey gap of less than a foot between Mr. Pierson's work and my later work. There is however, no deed gap. Both descriptions call to the north line of Section 17 (south line of Section 8) and are currently under common ownership. To survey what is now Tax Lot 2300, I held Mr. Pierson's pins for the southerly lines but held the aforesaid sixteenth corner as the northwest corner and then set the northeast corner at deed record distance along the Section line (Mr. Pierson's pin in this area had been removed).

The southeast corner of Lot 13 in Lithia Creek Estates also had been removed. To replace this pin, I determined the right of way radius from the found centerline monuments and held the record curve central angle from the Plat.
