

LOCATION:

Located in the Northeast Quarter of Section 30, Township 37 South, Range 1 West, Willamette Base and Meridian, Jackson County, Oregon.

PURPOSE:

To survey and monument three tracts that are either owned by the Community Health Center or are proposed for future expansion.

BASIS OF BEARINGS:

The centerline of East Main Street between Genesse Street and Crater Lake Avenue as shown on Filed Survey No. 18643.

PROCEDURE:

Monuments from adjacent surveys were located and tied by traverse. City of Medford reference monuments were used to establish the position of the southeast corner of DLC 42 and the intersection of East Main and Genesse Street. The Portland Avenue alignment was determined from the found pin at the northwest corner of the Lindley Addition and the iron pipe found at the northeast corner of the Consolidated Addition No. 2. The Myrtle Street alignment was determined from a record distance along the centerline of East Main and found monuments from Filed Survey No. 18643. There is no record of any original monuments set for Jackson's Second Addition to Medford. Lots 1 through 8 of the Addition are bounded by East Main on the north, Myrtle Street on the West, the Consolidated Addition No. 2 on the east, and Taylor Street on the south. Of these, the location of Taylor Street is probably the most questionable. Surveyor L.N. Dow, while working within Jackson's Second Addition, found a nail at the intersection of Taylor and Myrtle Streets in 1951 (Survey No. 321) and used the nail for the alignment of Myrtle Street but did not use it to proportion distances in the north-south direction between East Main and Taylor Street. Surveyor Kerry Bradshaw found the nail in 2005 and held it for the alignment of Taylor Street between Cottage Street and Myrtle Street. He then used the alignment to proportion lots within Block One of Jackson's Addition with good results. The nail appears to have been removed during a recent overlay of the streets. Using the record position of the nail and projecting the alignment of Taylor Street to the east, would make the calculated north-south dimensions of Jackson's Second Addition approximately 0.4 feet longer than record. If this distance is proportioned through the block, it would place the client's south line approximately 0.3 feet southerly of a concrete block wall that follows the south line of Lot 5 of said Second Addition. Since using record distances would fit the existing improvements better than a proportionate measurement, I held record distance from East Main Street for this line.
