Survey Narrative to Comply with ORS 209.250

Location: Block 3 of the Original Town of Jacksonville (1871); T37S R2W W.M. in the NW ¼ of S32; Jackson County, OR

Survey For: Jackson County

Date of Survey: Field: January 7, 2011

<u>Purpose:</u> To survey and map the utilities in the vicinity of the U. S. Hotel as located per Oregon Utility Locating Service and the City of Jacksonville. To correct a drafting error which occurred during the course of survey number 20681 which incorrectly located the easement described in ORJCO Document 71-10674. To map the traveled way, utilized to access the U.S. Hotel and the adjoining properties to the east.

<u>Procedure:</u> Utilizing a Trimble TSC2 Data collector, a Trimble 5600 Robotic Total Station determine topographic positions of utilities and traveled way as shown.

Boundary Determination:

Monuments of record were recovered per survey number 20681. Boundaries shown here on are in accordance with survey number 20681.

Easement Location:

A non-exclusive easement for right of way purposes was located during the course of survey number 20681 per Document 71-10674 and was incorrectly shown on page 2 of the aforementioned survey. The easement location has been corrected on this survey. The property where this easement was originally created is encumbered by the City of Jacksonville Fire House and is inaccessible. The current traveled way accessing the U.S. Hotel and the adjoining properties to the east is shown. It should be noted that the 1969 Jackson County aerial photo 3-9 on file with the Jackson County Assessor evidences the current traveled way as being in utilized since 1969. Document 71-10674 located this easement to the north of Jackson County property, though the 1969 aerial photo and traveled way show evidence of a different location. It cannot be definitively ascertained that a latent ambiguity existed in document 71-10674 by reversing the location of this easement 180 degrees. Though the extrinsic evidence gathered strongly points to this possibility.
