

The centerline of the county road 80 ft. right of way was determined from the 1910 road records distance of 273 ft. from the section corner. From this point northerly, the centerline was determined by a best fit of the current asphalt alignment compared with the engineered right of way as indicated in the 1945 County Engineer map of Antioch Road, Sta -0+68.1 to Sta 402+67.4, filed in the Office of County Surveyor as Roll Map 2/3.

Basis of bearing: CS 18737, along the east boundary of Section 3.

SURVEY NARRATIVE TO COMPLY WITH PARAGRAPH 209.250 OREGON REVISED STATUTES

SURVEY FOR:

LOCATION:

Southwest quarter of Section 2 and southeast quarter of Section 3

T 35 S, R 2 W, WM. Jackson County, Oregon

PURPOSE:

Locate and monument the exterior boundary of that property described in

Doc. No. 75-11790, Jackson Co. Official Records, with exceptions.

PROCEDURE:

The section corner common to Sections 2, 3, 10 and 11 was determined

and monumented by double proportionate measurement by the Jackson

County Surveyor in Survey No. 11096, in 1988. The brass capped pipe monument was found in good condition, as were the bearing trees with the exception of the northeast white oak, which is now down.

The brass cap monument at the one quarter corner between Sections 2 and 3, set by single proportionate measurement on said Survey No. 11096, was found about 1 inch below the asphalt road surface of Antioch Road. The two references from that survey were found in good condition.

TL 600 was originally part of the herein surveyed tract. In Doc. No. 94-16589, the description of TL 600 begins at the South 1/16th corner on the line between Sections 2 and 3, and proceeds with a southeast bearing and distance. These were retained as described. The next line, running "West", was held parallel with the north boundary of the southeast quarter of the southeast quarter of Section 3, as marked in CS 18737. The west boundary was then held perpendicular to the north and south boundaries. Note that the resulting length of the west boundary differs from deed record by an additional 10.63 ft. The current owner of TL 600 showed me a map prepared by the grantor which was labeled with the same bearings and distances as called in the deed description. The map was signed and sealed by an Oregon licensed land surveyor, but did not indicate any monuments set. The discrepancy along the west boundary appears to be a 10 ft. mathematical error, rather than a scrivener's error.

TL 501 was also originally a part of the herein surveyed tract, and was originally described in Doc. No. 77-02378 of the Official Records of Jackson County The description begins at the Southeast 1/16th corner, and proceeds along the quarter-quarter section line "East 984.0 ft.". The record distance along the north boundary of TL 600 is "336 ft." Adding these two distances together equals 1320 ft., an exact quarter mile. However, the measured distanced is 1329.64 feet. Since the description for TL 501 did not make a call to the boundary of TL 600, a gap was created between TL 600 and TL 501 of 9.64 ft., which would still be a part of TL 500. TL's 501 and 600 are currently owned by the same person, Ronald Lee Kern. The 9.64 ft. gap lies between his two ownerships. When TL 501 was created, my client, Mary Ballestrazze, was the grantor, and the tract was conveyed to Ronald Lee Kern as grantee. In discussing the gap between the two parcels, both grantor and grantee indicated to me that the intent was for the two tracts to be adjoining. Therefore the west boundary of TL 600 and the east boundary of TL 501 were marked as a common line, thereby eliminating said 9.63 ft. gap.
