

PROCEDURE:

There have been three recorded surveys in Block I of the Railroad Addition, FS 7470, FS 10879, and FS 12509. All three of these surveys were done prior to 1992 and involved the northerly tier of lots north of the alley along "B" Street. Only one survey, FS 7470 surveyed the block to determine its dimensions. That survey utilized the existing centerline monument at 6th and "B" Street, monument references at 7th and "B" Street and monuments on Main Street at 6th Street and 7th Street to define the block. I'm uncertain what criteria was used to determine the location of "C" Street, I assume proportionate measure, but plat record distances from centerline intersections on "B" Street to centerline monuments on Main Street are not given on the survey map and there is no narrative.

In 1992 the city went about placing monuments at the centerline intersection locations based on previous surveys in this area. However at the 7th and "C" street location an original square iron bar was found. And at the 7th and "B" Street location a manhole occupied the centerline intersection so 5' offset monuments were set on the street center lines. The affect of finding the original monument at 7th and "C" Street changed the bearing and distance of Seventh Street and "C" Street in Block I from those used in previous surveys.

This survey proceeded to tie to these existing street centerline monuments which control the location of the streets defining the block. The block sidelines were placed at the plat record 35' from these center lines. Monuments from the existing surveys namely FS7470 and FS 10879 were located and held for the northerly line of the East -West Alley. The south line of the alley was located parallel with and 16' distant from said north line. The centerline of the North-South alley was placed midway on the south line of the block and the south line of the East-West alley and the alley given its record 16' width. The intent was to proportion the location of the lots of the subject property from the south line of the block to the south line of the East- West alley. However prior to setting pins a search was made at the proportioned corners for existing monuments not of record. This search found existing monuments near the proportioned corners at four locations. Judging from the character of the monuments(e.g. pinched top pipe) I believe that these must have been the result of a previous unrecorded survey by LE Ager. However no such survey could be found in the file of unrecorded surveys at the County Surveyors Office. None the less, proportionate measure being the choice of last resort, I accepted the existing monuments from the unrecorded survey as the property corner monuments of long standing. These monuments were held for the East -West lot lines while maintaining the proportioned location of the North -South Alley and the 35' street widths from the centerline monuments. Property corner monuments were set at the southeast and southwest corners. It should be noted that an existing one story wood frame building straddles the property line between the two tracts and is shown on the survey.

This survey was accomplished using a Topcon GPT 3002W total station and conventional surveying techniques.
