


On the basis of the foregoing, with the positions of the Northwest and Southwest corners thus determined, the let dimensions were computed and corners subsequently monumented.

The let boundary as monumented agrees with old fence lines. The l'iren pin found on the north boundary of Maple Street agrees within 0.13 feet of a computed let corner and measuring along Maple Street from this pin record distances generally check with fences and hedgerows.

pipes found along Putman Street were set in or about 1928 by a local surveyer, new retired, according to a resident in the area. This surveyer, when contacted, disclaimed making the survey. These pipes apparently have stimulated a large amount of contreversy through the passing years resulting in quitclaims along some "let lines". No evidence was recovered which can establish the acceptability of these pipes.

It was economically infeasible to bring into this survey additional control for comparative purposes which may exist to the North in both Edwards and Beattys Addition. Additional work in that area will unquestionably be necessary before the Southwest corner of Edwards Addition can be acceptably re-established.

In order to proceed with this survey, it was first considered essential to determine the most probable location of Blocks 1 and 2 of Meekers Addition. The deed reference listed above preceeds the date of this subdivision and provides control along the North line of Block 1 by a distance tie to the Southwest corner of Government Lot 6. In the absence of original block and let corners known to be in existence, centerline street control was held for Austin, Pine and Maple Streets. This control was in existence in 1912.

The iron pin monuments in Niantic Street recovered by Sawyer's 1912 survey were net found since the recent improvement of that street has undoubtedly resulted in their loss.

Accordingly, Putnam Street has been held parallel to Maple Street with lot lines at right angles thereto as indicated on the original plate

The Northwest corner of Meekers Addition was determined by holding deed record minus four feet along the North line of the subdivision West of the Southwest corner of Government Let 6 which is in agreement with the plat distance along the North line of Block 1 of the original plat, the record closure of which was considered surprisingly close.

In 1912, surveyer Sawyer shows this corner as being on the centerline of a 16 foot alley. The Edwards Addition plat substantially agrees with Sawyer. However, Edwards Addition plat shows a four foot overlap on Beattys Addition which suggests that Sawyer actually ran to the Southwest corner of Edwards Addition. This seems to be the case as existing pipes along the south side of Austin Street are approximately four feet East of these pipes along Austin Street to the North. According to a local resident whe has lived in the area since 1928, it has always been a matter of has been this 4 feet difference.

In consideration of this four feet difference, all the record measure; ments made along Austin Street West from either the Southwest corner of Gevernment Let 6 or the monument at Austin and Putnam Streets agree within 0.78 feet.

an effect of the control of the state of the second of the The Southwest corner of the subdivision was determined by helding a coordinate point computed from information secured from survey 1689. This point is in general agreement with eld deeds and in fact is 0.37 feet ever record. 19.88 feet Southwesterly along the edge of Maple Street was found a wood post 4 feet deep which is in agreement with the coordinate point by 0.11 feet. Pipes found Hertheasterly are in general agreement.
