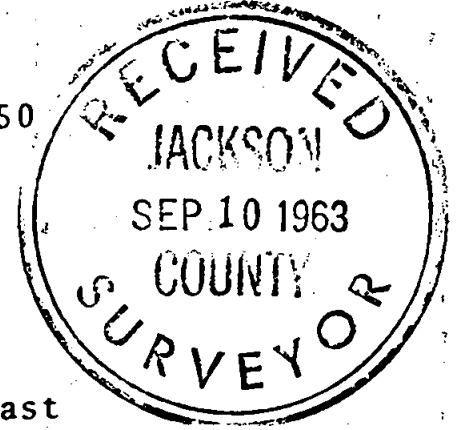

SURVEY NARRATIVE TO COMPLY WITH O.R.S. 209.250



FOR: Jackson County Engineer,
Court House
Medford, Oregon

PURPOSE: To locate, monument and reference, the East Boundary of Section 23, Township 33 South, Range 1 East, Willamette Meridian.

PROCEDURE:

Ran transit-chain traverse between the Southeast and Northeast Corners of Section 23.

The Northeast Corner and East Quarter Corner were monumented, referenced and recorded in the re-establishment volume on file in the office of the County Surveyor.

At the North One-sixteenth Section Corner common to Sections 23 & 24, set a 1" x 36" galvanized iron pipe, 35" in the ground for corner, from which:

A 36" B. Oak, scribed "RS 281-BT" bears North $31\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ East, 104.3 feet to the face of the upper blaze;

An 18" B. Oak, scribed "RS 281-BT" bears South $81\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$ East, 74.9 feet to the face of the upper blaze.

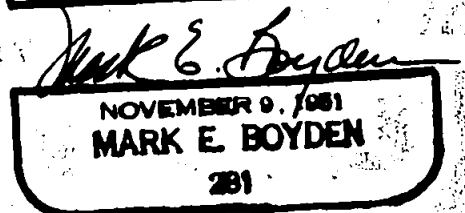
At the South One-sixteenth Section Corner common to Sections 23 & 24, set a 1" x 36" galvanized iron pipe, 28" in the ground for corner, from which:

A 36" Cottonwood, scribed "RS 281-BT" bears South $1\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ West, 164.6 feet to the face of the upper blaze;

A 20" Fir, scribed "RS 281-BT" bears South 49° West, 236.2 feet to the face of the upper blaze.

Meridian was determined from a mean of four solar observations.
