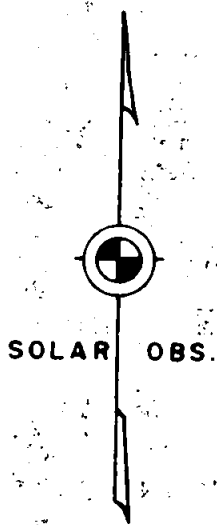

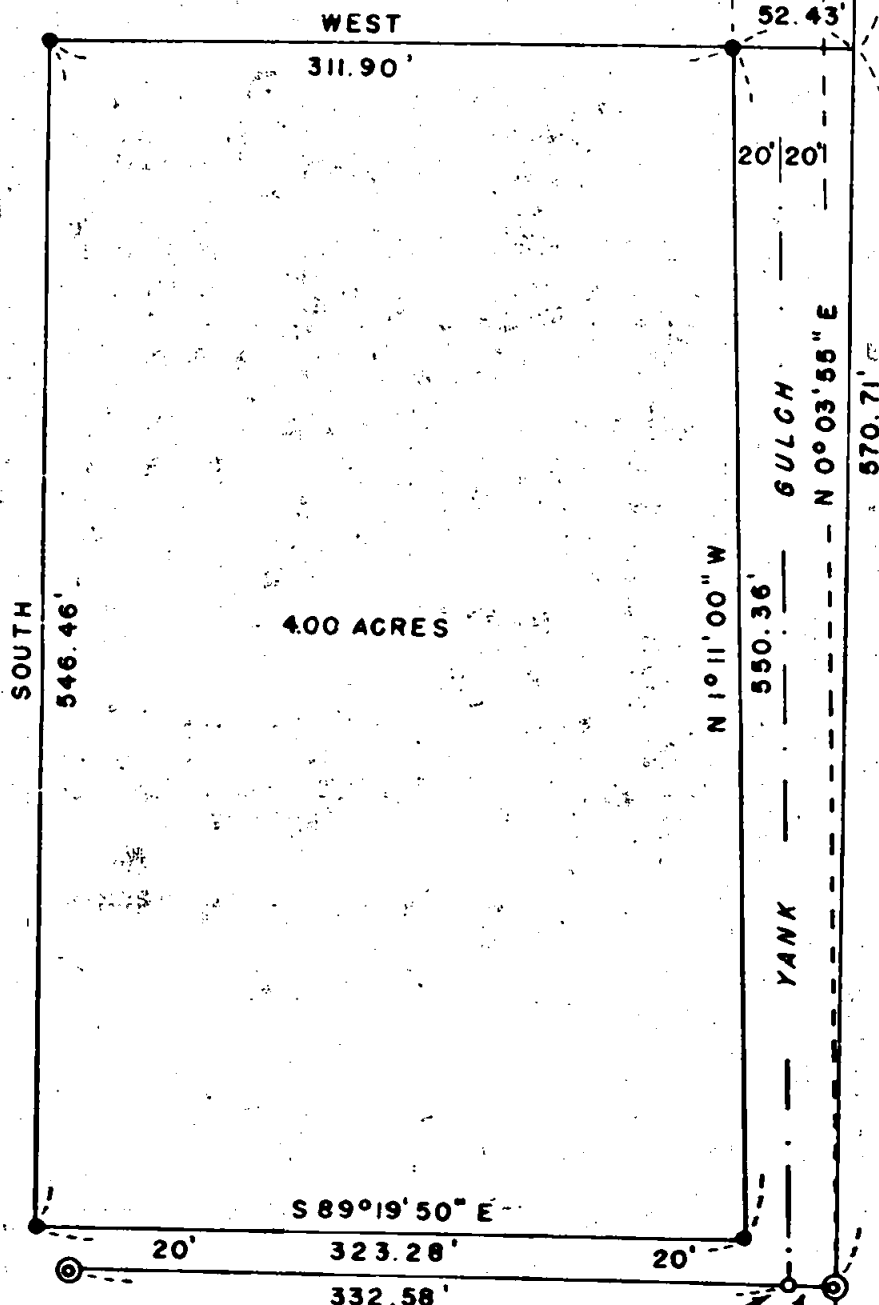

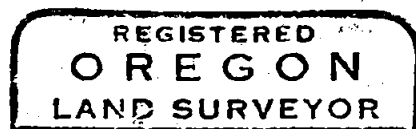
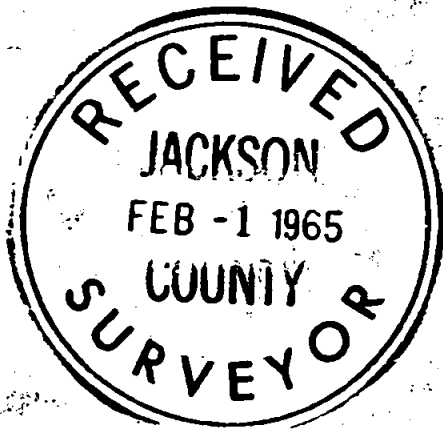
Procedure :

1910 road P.I.'s were not recovered. Accordingly, physical centerline was held for the Yank Gulch Road which generally coincides with traverse notes of 1910 in county field book 4.

The present road location does not agree with the road petition centerline described in volume 2, page 114 of Road Records in that said centerline should be located parallel to and 20 feet West of the D.L.C. line.

The ell corner of D.L.C. 67 was recovered on the basis of testimony of Mr. O. W. Abbott of Wagner Creek Road, Talent, Oregon. Mr. Abbott remembers that approximately 40 years ago an oak bearing tree was located "several feet East" of the ell corner, a wagon spring leaf, and that the tree had writing on it". On the basis of said testimony, I recovered said spring leaf and replaced same with a $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 30''$ iron pipe from which the NE corner of a concrete pump house foundation bears $S 4^{\circ}46'45'' E$ 95.40 feet distant; the center of a 19.5" white oak bears $S 28^{\circ}00'55'' W$ 123.4 feet distant; a nail in the crotch of a Black walnut tree bears $N 14^{\circ}04'50'' E$ 68.77 feet distant.
