BASIS OF BEARING: Survey for Eugene Burrill, by E.A. McGinty

PRECEDENCE OF SURVEY:

Surveyed a tract of land for the purpose of determining the boundaries of a proposed location of tract.

The center of the County road was determined from retracement of Rhodes survey. At point No. 2, being in the center of existing road and midway between point No. 1 and the Southeast corner of Section 28, thence by orienting bearings 5'20" to the apparent basis of bearing of County Surveyor Rhodes who made the survey on road petition, made a retracement of road as shown and projected the course S. 47°26'40" West to intersect 1953 center line shown on survey for E. Burrill. This retracement fits road as it is fairly close for most portions of the existing roads and fence lines. A search was made for the original field notes which should be of public record, and none could be found.

- 1. Found a 1/2 in. gas pipe set by Co. surveyor Rhodes from which a standard U.S. Dept. of Interior capped 2 in. pipe bears S. 2°40'40" East, 47.34 ft.
 - 2. 1/2 in. x 24 in. reinforcing steel flush with the surface.
 - 3. 1 in. \times 3/8 in. \times 24 in. iron bar, 8 in. deep.
 - 4. 1 in. \times 3/8 in. \times 42 in. iron bar, 12 in. deep.
 - 5. 1/2 in. x 18 in. iron pin, blush with the surface.
 - 6. Found a County road spike flush, see E. Burrill survey.
 - 7. R. R. spike set on E. Burrill survey
 - 8. Found a 1 in. iron pipe, 3 ins. above the ground.

Other monuments set on this survey being 5/8 in. \times 24 in. iron pins set flush with the surface.
