Tract situated in Donation Land Claim 37; Section 2, Township 39 South, Range 1 West, Willamette Meridian In Jackson County, Oregon. LOCATION:

PURPOSE:

To establish a division line set forth by sale agreement to originate at the intersection of the center line of Wagner Creek and the east right of way line of Wagner Creek county road and terminate at a point near the Talent Irrigation District irrigation ditch on the north boundary of parcel III as recorded in volume 504, page 222 of the Deed Records of Jackson County, Oregon, thus severing that portion of parcel III lying north of Wagner Creek county road and east of the division line thus established. Also to provide description of above mentioned severed parcel.

PROCEDURE:

Found D.L.C. corner monuments and a monument at the intersection of the east line of D.L.C. #37 and the easterly R/W line of Wagner Creek county road. Since no monument exists at the N.E. corner of parcel III and further that the fence on the north line of occupation of parcel III was found to disagree substantially with the deed record, my original intent of reestablishing the north boundary of parcel III was abandon as the owner did not wish to participate in the cost of the survey required. Original intentions to establish, reestablish and monument all corners of the severed tract were abandon and attention directed solely to the requirements of the sale agreement. For this purpose, I traversed from the S.E. corner of D.L.C. #37 to the intersection of the center line of Wagner Creek and the
