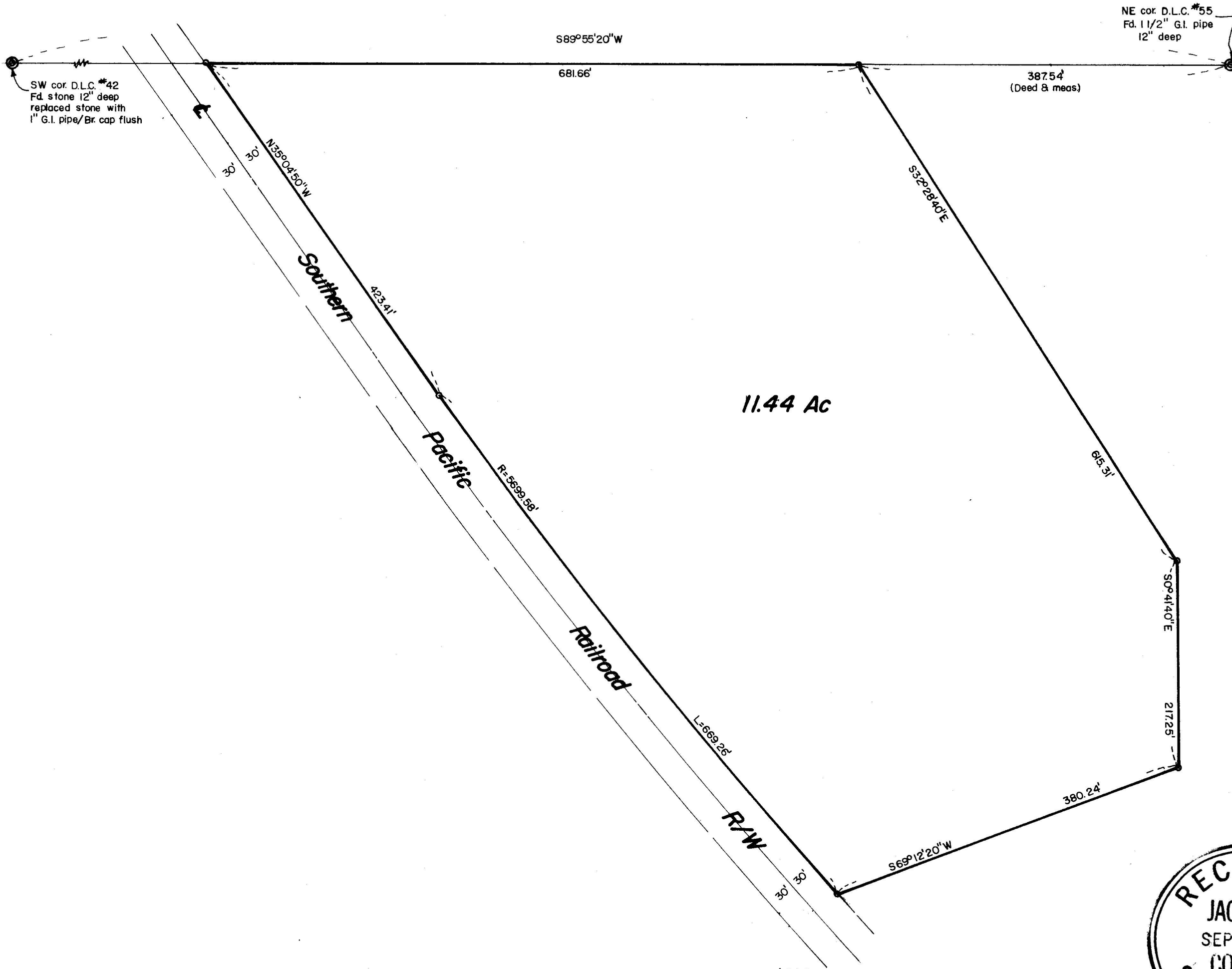


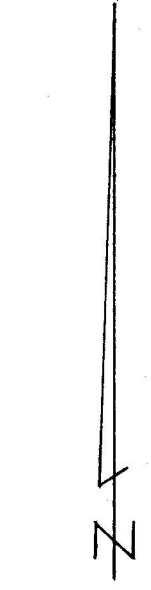

SURVEY NARRATIVE TO COMPLY WITH O.R.S. 209.250,
REVISED BY CHAPTER 555, C.I. 1963

FOR: Fountain Lumber of Oregon
P. O. Box 241
Talent, Oregon

PURPOSE: To monument the boundaries of the tract described
in Volume 416, Page 79 of the Deed Records of Jackson
County, Oregon.

PROCEDURE:

Traversed the North boundary of Donation Land Claim No. 55
from corner monuments found as established by the County Surveyor.

Also ran a closed-loop traverse around the subject tract.

The railroad location was established from the mean average
of the centerline of the existing main track tangents, where the
point of intersection was forced in by computation. It was found
that the measured delta agreed within $0^{\circ} 00' 15''$ of the delta
shown on the Southern Pacific Company railroad right-of-way map.
The centerline degree-of-curvature was considered $1^{\circ} 00'$ as shown
on said railroad map.

The legal description of the subject tract mathematically
closed within 1-foot. Therefore, the deed distances and angles
as measured from the North boundary of Donation Land Claim No. 55
were utilized for boundary control. The deed calls of said
description referred to the railroad boundary, and therefore the
subject tract was monumented to said true railroad boundary.

Monumented the tract as shown on the attached map.
