

S 1/16 corner common to Section 34 and 35

Set a 3/4"x30" iron pin for corner from which I scribed a 19.1" White fir "S 1/16 S 34 483 BT" which bears  $N62\frac{3}{4}$  W 27.46 feet; an 18.5" White fir "S 1/16 S 35 483 BT" bears  $N16\frac{1}{4}$  E 29.00 feet.

Proportionate 1/4 corner common to Sections 34 and 35

Set a 3/4"x30" brass capped iron pin for corner from which I scribed a 19.3" White fir "1/4 S 34 483 BT" which bears N18 $\frac{3}{4}$ W 10.22 feet; an 18" White fir "1/4 S 35 483 BT" which bears N63 $\frac{1}{2}$ E 21.60 feet.

N 1/16 corner common to Sections 34 and 35

Set a 3/4"x30" iron pin for corner from which I scribed a 17.1" White fir "N 1/16 S 34 483 BT" which bears N58°W 14.52 feet; a 16.4" White fir "N 1/16 S 35 483 BT" which bears N76°E 20.37 feet.

All trees measured to center.

Purpose

To define the boundary of the East Half of Section 34 and set the

sixteenth corners shown.

Bearing

Based on meridian of Government record for the east boundary

Section 34.

## PROCEDURE

Sixteenth corners shown were set at computed positions from a random line closed traverse around the perimeter of the half section.

The south quarter corner of Section 34 was found per original survey notes to be a 41x41 mound of stones in a brush field, very old and interlaced with manzanita roots. The mound was definitely not a natural formation or considered to be a mound erected by timber cruisers at an approximate corner position.

Corners set or reestablished are as follows:

E 1/16 corner common to Sections 27 and 34

Set a 3/4"x30" iron pin for corner from which I scribed a 6" White fir "E 1/16 S 27 483 BT" which bears N68°W 7.02 feet; a 5" White fir "E 1/16 S 34 483 BT" which bears S74°E 23.40 feet

1/4 corner common to Sections 27 and 34

Found stone from which a down snag with scribing intact bears S52°E 56.76 feet and a down snag with scribing intact bears N3°E 24.42 feet. Set a 3/4"x30" brass capped iron pin at exact position of stone (placing stone alongside) and scribed a 12" White Fir "1/4 S 27 483 BT" which bears N18°E 13.03 feet, a 14" White fir "1/4 S 34 483 BT" which bears S34°W 7.03 feet.

South 1/4 corner Section 34

Found a 4\*x4\* mound of stones at exact center of which I set a 3/4"x30" brass capped iron pin for corner from which I scribed a 28" Ponderosa pine "1/4 S 34 483 BT" which bears N4620E 75.04 feet, a 13" Ponderosa pine "1/4 S 34 483 BT" which bears S5920W 51.10 feet. Brass cap is marked for Section 34 only.

Section corner common to Sections 34 and 35

Found a notched stone which is witnessed by the original bearing trees. I set a 3/4"x30" brass capped iron pin at exact position of stone and placed stone alongside. The section corner common to Sections 2 and 3 was found to be a unnotched stone bearing Easterly 52.52 feet which is witnessed by 3 original bearing trees.

E 1/16 corner on south boundary Section 34

Set a 3/4"x30" iron pin for corner from which I scribed a  $23\frac{1}{2}$ " Ponderosa pine "E 1/16 S 34 483 BT" which bears  $N48\frac{1}{4}$ 0W 32.00 feet; a 29" Ponderosa pine "E 1/16 S 34 483 BT" which bears  $N6\frac{1}{2}$ E 41.17 feet.
