



This section survey was accomplished by a combination of conventional ground traverse, and approximately 9.15 miles of tellurometer traverse, with a computed closure on a loop of 1:151,378.

The center-line of the County road is as constructed, as the County Engineer has no data of record for this portion of road.

Bearings established from a mean of three out of four Solar Observations.

At the East $\frac{1}{4}$ corner of Section 11, a $\frac{1}{2}$ iron pipe with metal cap stamped

T 39S, R 3 W \frac{1}{4} COR 11 + 12: 505

was set. Both original B.T.'s still standing, with scribing visible in the S.E. B.T.

PURPOSE:

To survey and monument that portion of the $E_{\mathbb{R}}^{1}S_{\bullet}E_{\bullet}^{\frac{1}{4}}$ Section 11, T. 39 S., R. 3 W., lying north of the County Road.

PROCEDURE: A thorough search was made in the field, resulting in the recovery of the corners as indicated on the accompanying Plat. The Section corner common to Sections 11, 12, 13, and 14 was established by double proportion from the East 1/4 corner of Section 11, the Southwest section corner of Section 11, the South $\frac{1}{4}$ corner of Section 12, and the West decorner of Section 13. A 2 iron pipe with metal cap stamped

T 39 S, R 3 W 11 12 14 | 13 505

was set for the corner from which bear the following:

15" W. Oak N 63°14'30" W 38.69 feet scribed BT 25" double W. Oak N 12°40' E 176.76 feet scribed BT S 0°08128" W I.Pin 129.44 feet in fence

At the South $\frac{1}{4}$ corner of Section 11, a $\frac{1}{8}$ iron pipe with metal cap stamped

> T 39 S, R 3 W 붚 Cor 1,1 14 505

was set by single proportion from the S.W. and S.E. section corners of Section 11. From this pipe with metal cap bear the following:

12" W. Oak N 27°13'30" W 27.55 feet scribed BT 28" P.Pine S 40°55*30" E 42.25 feet scribed BT 3m I.Pipe S 27°46'35" W 67.25 feet (See Plat Detail)

The surveyor who set the aforementioned $\frac{3}{4}$ pipe in 1945 for the South corner of Section 11, admitted he had set said pipe without any proportionate measurement, or evidence of original Bearing Trees. This pipe was therefor disregarded as being a $\frac{1}{4}$ Corner. The $\frac{3}{4}$ iron pin found to have been set for the El/16 corner (see Plat Detail) was also found to be set at 1319.83 feet from the disregarded pipe, and therefor has no validity as a true 1/16 corner.

At the North $rac{1}{4}$ corner of Section 11, a $rac{1}{2}$ " iron pipe with metal cap stamped

> T 39S, R 3 W 1 COR 2 11 505

was set from which bears the following: 20" W. Oak N 11°58'55" W 86.47 feet All distances to bearing trees scribed "BT" set by this survey are measured to the face containing the scribing.
