Survey Narrative to Comply with Paragraph 209.250 Oregon Revised Statutes

In re: The rehabilitation of the one-quarter section corner, common to sections 21 and 28, Township 38 South, Range 3 West of the Willamette Base and Meridian, Jackson County, Oregon.

1/4 Section Corner 21 and 28
Found the 1 inch galvanized iron pipe and the two bearing trees as reported in the County Surveyors re-establishment records and dated April 18, 1935. The above mentioned bearing trees are as follows:

a stump of a 22 inch fir with the BT visible bears S. 12°02'W. a distance of 74.43 feet to the face of blaze. (county record; scribed a 24 inch red fir CS-BT and bears S.124°W., 74.5 feet.)

a 21 inch black oak with CS visible in relief bears $N.61^{\circ}25^{\circ}W$. a distance of 47.93 feet to the face of the upper blaze. (county record; an 18inch black oak scribed CS-BT bears $N.61^{\circ}_{4}W$., 48.0 feet.)


From said 1/4 section corner, I take two new bearing trees as follows:

scribed a ll inch diameter Laurel $\frac{1}{4}$ S28 BT which bears S.09°16'E. a distance of 47.17 feet to the center of said tree.

scribed a 6 inch diameter Fir $\frac{1}{4}$ S21 BT which bears N.20°07'E. a distance of 43.45 feet to the center of said tree.
