

Section corner common to Sections 34,35,2, and 3. Found two live trees, and stump hole of another tree, which are presumed to be original bearing trees. No common point of intersection, within about 2 feet, could be made, and no scribing was found in the two live trees, both of which have very old chopped out, rotted faces. A mound of stone with very old oak stub was found at the approximate corner location. After several hours of trying to determine the exact original corner location by various combinations, the following procedure was employed. A point of intersection was established by proportioning the measured distances against original record distances from the B.T.'s. Apparently by coincidence, this procedure gave a corner location exactly at the aforementioned oak stub. Set a I"X30" pipe with brass cap, stamped:

T.34S, 3 2 T.35S, R.2W. 1968

SURVEY NARRATIVE TO COMPLY WITH O.R.S. 209.250 REVISED BY CHAPTER 555, O.L. 1963

FOR:

Mr. A.E. Perkins 3100 Woodland Road Grants Pass, Oregon

PURPOSE:

To survey and monument the S.W.¼, and the S.E.¼ N.W.¼, Section 35, T.34S.,R.2 W., and the N.E.¼N.W.¼ Section 2, Township 35S.,R.2W., lying North of Jones Road.

PROCEDURE:

Searched for and recovered the necessary section and one quarter corners, as shown on the accompanying Plat, for said Section 35.

For Section 2, no sign of the West % corner nor the S.W. Section corner could be found, making a proper subdivision extremely expensive. Therefor, the North-South center-line of the Section was traversed, and a parcel monumented as shown on the Plat, with the South and West boundaries to be established by Boundary Line Agreement. The client has repeatedly been informed both verbally and in writing, of the advisability of entering into the Boundary Line Agreement, but apparently nothing has been accomplished so far. Suggested descriptions have been furnished to the client.

It is hereby made of record that the Southeast and Southwest corners of the parcel in Section 2 are not the true Centernorth 1/16 corner and the Northwest 1/16 corners respectively.

Corner data is as follows:

One Quarter corner between Sections 26 and 35; Found original 30" Pine, bearing S45°E, 27.72 feet, now a windfall. Found scribing. Also found original 3" Black Oak, N40°W, 71.94 feet, now a rotted windfall. No scribing left. Set a E"X30" iron pipe with brass cap, stamped: T.34S, R.2W.

from which bears the following new B.T.'s.
2I" D.Fir, scribed 1/4S BT S68°23'W 50.43 feet
10" Madrone " 1/4S BT N40°50'W 37.46 feet



Section corner common to Sections 26,27,34, and 35. Found S.W. B.T. and N.E. B.T. to be live trees, and stump hole of N.W. B.T. Chopped out N.E. B.T. and found scribing. Must be measured on slope to intersect distances from other B.T.'s. Set a l"X30" iron pipe with brass cap stamped:

One Quarter corner between Sections 35 and 36
Found both original B.T.'s to be live trees. Chopped out S.E. B.T. and found scribing. At the intersection of record distances from the two trees, set a 1"X30" pipe with brass cap, stamped:

T.34S, R.2W.
