

PURPOSE:

To survey and monument Lot 3 and a part of Lot 2, Block 1, ROANOKE ADDITION to the City of Medford, Oregon.

PROCEDURE:

Recovered the four street monuments around Block, and surveyed between them. A deficiency of 0.42 feet was found between the monument at Main and Rose, and the monument at Main and Quince. The survey was then extended each direction on Main St. to determine which monuments were in error.

Further research revealed that in 1946, C.Z. Boyden was retained by the City of Medford to conduct a rather extensive survey to establish certain street centers in West Medford. The 1946 survey produced substantially the same results as the survey conducted by this office.

On page 64 of the final notes submitted to the City of Medford, Boyden proposes and recommends the street center at Quince and Main be moved 0.41 feet East from the present monument. It was also determined that the True Center-line of Peach is 0.11 feet East of the monument at Main. In view of the results of these two surveys, these proposed street centers, rather than the present monumentation, was used in determining the property lines.

It is interesting to note that the $\frac{3}{4}$ pipe at the Southwest corner of CROWELLS ADDITION, said pipe being the east line of the alley, fell exactly 20.0 feet from our Lot pin. Evidently some early day surveyor also disregarded the monument at Main and Quince. The 1 square pin at Rose and Main was found to be 0.15 feet South of the center-line of Main. The nail set by Boyden was found on line. Final dimensions used are as shown on the accompanying Plate
