

SURVEY NARRATIVE TO COMPLY WITH O.R.S. 209.250 REVISED BY CHAPTER 555, O.L. 1963

FOR:

School District 549 C 500 Monroe Street Medford, Oregon

PURPOSE:

To survey and monument lots 10 and 11 of Mace Subdivision and a metes and bounds parcel adjacent to the south.

PROCEDURE:

The center-line of Howard Avenue was established from spikes set by the City of Medford as recorded in City field book 280. The "tentative center-line" for Mace Road, as established in these field notes, was used as described and referenced. Further research revealed Recorded Survey No. 582 by Lester Smith, dated June, 1953, which established a 1" pipe at the Southwest corner of Mace Subdivision. This pipe was recovered though it has apparently been disturbed by the growth of a large tree. The location for the Southwest corner of Mace Subdivision was, therefore, determined at record distance from Mace Road, following the procedure of the City of Medford in establishing the location of Mace Road.

It should be noted that lots 10 and 11 of Mace Subdivision had previously been surveyed and monumented by Lovejoy in Recorded Survey No. 392. However, since Lovejoy made no attempt to determine the West boundary of D.L.C. 59, and merely went North, South, East and West on the basis of a Solar Observation from the Southwest corner of said D.L.C., the resulting lot locations are highly questionable, to say the least.

Several monuments apparently established by Recorded Survey Nos. 392, 827 and 582 were recovered and are as shown on the Plat. Some of these monuments may have been disturbed from their original location REGISTERED

by fence construction.
