

Survey No. 1619 along the South line Sec. 4


Precedence of Survey:

This survey is dependent on previous surveys of record file no. 1619 and 2296 and the accuracy of previous surveys in old County Surveyor's Records under 'Y' indicate a variation could exist as to the previous West line of the Donation Land Claim and the location of the South quarter corner, although both previous surveys 1619 and 2296 and old records apparently have no official status. See County Surveyor's Recestablished Corners and said surveys. It would appear that the easterly line could be disputed. Deed calls for a monument which cannot be positively identified, but calls are to certain designated lines. Apparently the best solution would be a boundary line agreement or Judicial decree.

At the Northeast corner of D.L.C. 48, set 1/2" x 18" iron pin in the center of rock mound from which original bearing trees were recovered.

Monuments set being 5/8" x 24" iron pins flush.
