At corner I set a G.I. Pipe 30 inches long, 1 1/2 inches in diam., 28 inches in the ground with Brass Cap stamped "T39S" and deposited stone alongside from which the following B.T.s:

A 16 inch fir, bears S. 89 $1/2^{\circ}$ W., 40.9 ft. dist. to center of tree, scribed "CS S25 BT".
