A Fir, 46 inches diam., brs. S.77°02' W., 21.9 feet (Gov't. Rec. S. 75° W., 22.4 feet) dist., to face of blaze opened and found scribing. OBT

On August 17, 1972 a returned visit to this corner revealed a 3/4" iron pin with 2%" diam. bronze cap mkd.

this pin is at the exact location of the above described stone. See Recorded Survey No. 5318.

SECTION CORNER common to Sections 19, 20, 29 and 30, Township 40 South, Range 2 East.

At the corner point found a 7"x7"x18" basalt stone with 5 notches on East and 2 notches on South face from which

SURVEY NARRATIVE TO COMPLY WITH PARAGRAPH 209.250 OREGON REVISED STATUTES

LOCATION:

Situated in the East half of Section 29, Township 40 South, Range 2 East of the Willamette Base and Meridian, Jackson County, Oregon.

PURPOSE:

To survey, monument and prepare legal descriptions for the tracts of land shown on the accompanying map, per clients request.

PROCEDURE:

Commenced this survey June 7, 1972 by searching for the Government Section and Quarter Section Corners necessary to subdivide Section 29, Township 40 South, Range 2 East.

After a complete on the ground investigation of said corners it was learned that the South quarter corner of Section 29 had been destroyed by Interstate Highway No. 5 construction, if in fact this corner was in at the time of construction. Proceeding Westward to the section corner common to Sections 29, 30, 31 and 32 a search was made for the original post and mound of stones as placed there by Nathaniel Ford, Government Contract Surveyor, around September 25, 1855. Nothing was found at this corner that could be positively identified as the original corner. Therefore, a search for the quarter corner common to Sections 30 and 31, was necessary. Before this corner was found and positively identified, it was necessary to tie the section corner common to Sections 30 and 31, only, as reestablished by the Cadastral Surveyor, Dept. of Interior, Bureau of Land Management. Then the quarter corner common to Sections 31 and 32 was needed. This corner and its references were in a very high state of deterioration and therefore, required that I find the section corner common to Sections 31 and 32, Township 40 South, Range 2 East and Sections 5 and 6, Township 41 South, Range 2 East to help verify the position of this quarter corner. With this data compiled and computed, proceeded to subdivide Section 29 as shown on the accompanying map.

At this time it should be noted that in running the North-South centerline of the Northeast quarter of said section, it was found that a house had been built over the line and onto my clients property. After much discussion with the party owning said house it was learned that apparently someone, maybe the State Highway survey crew, had surveyed some lines in this area and were thought to be the sixteenth section lines. However, without a legal subdivision of Section 29, as provided by law, the legal interior sixteenth section lines cannot be established. This encroachment is being settled at this time.

It should be noted that the distance between the Northeast Section corner and the North quarter corner of Section 29, Township 40 South, Range 2 East as reported on the Interstate Highway No. 5 maps, is in error by some 100 to 140 feet. Therefore, caution should be exercised when using these state maps in this area.

Nathaniel Ford under Contract No. 58, dated April 18th, 1855 ran the exterior boundaries of Section 29, Township 40 South, Range 2 East. Rufus S. Moore under Contract No. 637, dated May 15th, 1895 resurveyed the North boundary of Section 29. However, the corners as set by Nathaniel Ford were held in place by Rufus S. Moore. Rufus S. Moore does show a different set of values on the North boundary of Section 29 and I have shown both sets of data on my map.
